Vocabulary – body parts, daily routine, camping

Verbs – reflexive verbs, including those with stem-changes

Grammar – use of reflexive verbs and stem-changes, commands using “favor de”

Vocabulary – for the train and train stations

Verbs – Preterit of irregular verbs (hacer, querer, venir, poder, poner, saber, estar, andar and tener) and decir in the present and preterit.

Grammar – use of preterit of irregulars and prepositional pronouns

Chapter 4 – En el restaurante

Vocabulary – Identify foods, utensils, dishes, and ordering food and paying in a restaurant

Verbs – stem-changing verbs in present and preterit (pedir, servir, repetir, vestirse, preferir, dormir)

Grammar – adjectives of nationality and passive voice using “se”

Vocabulary – holidays

Verbs – the imperfect tense

Grammar – the use of regular and irregular verbs in the imperfect tense
