#### Spotlight on Safety

Parents, remember that if your child or anyone in your household takes a COVID-19 test school age children will need to stay home until

that family member receives a negative lab test (2-4-day result) or negative molecular rapid test. call Please Email or our school nurse (sarah.strickland@hcbe.net) if you have any COVID related issues in your home. This includes if anyone in your house currently has COVID symptoms or has recently taken a COVID test, even if negative. Also email her if your KCES student has been exposed to a positive person in the last 10 days. Please email her results and wait for clearance before sending your child back to school. Please do not send your children to school until clearance has been given by the county nurse. As always, make sure your child has been symptom and fever free for any illness for 24 hours prior to sending them to school.
