- 7) A—G + CTE Pathway

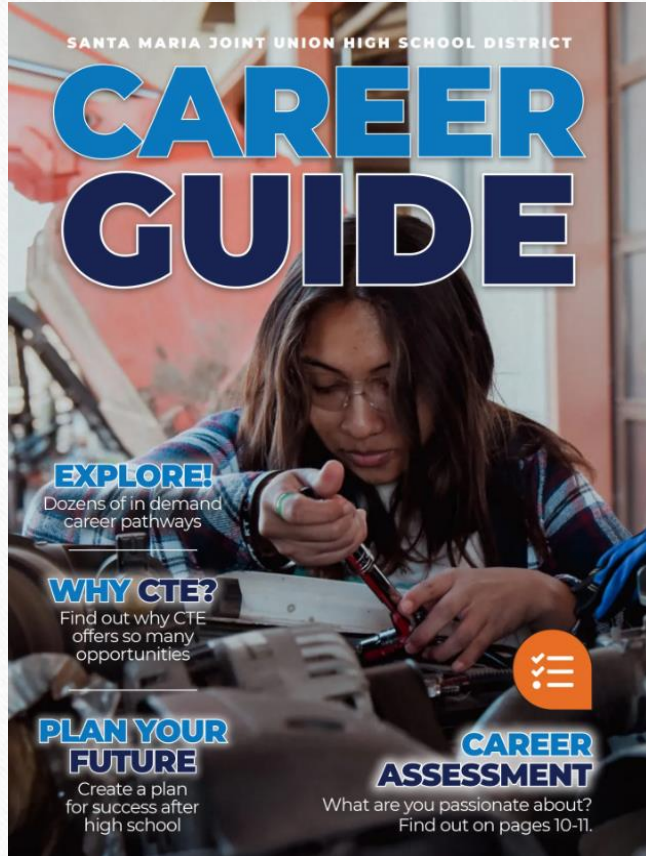

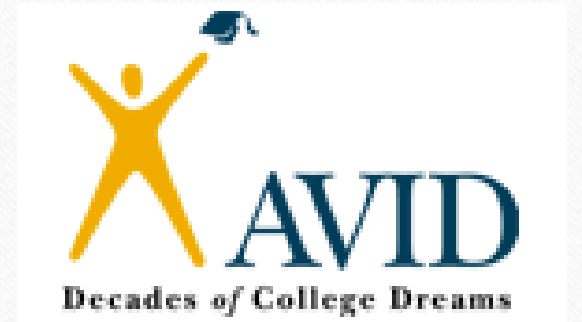
