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# TK and Kindergarten Mrs. Tinnin

Kindergarten students learned the letters b, e, I, and r. They are learning how to put a finger space in between words when they write and draw a picture that matches the phrase.

Kindergarten is working on adding two numbers. Students are using manipulatives to help identify two numbers that equal the whole number. They are learning how to read number sentences and find the missing number in an addition sentence. The test for this chapter is next week and then we will move on to subtraction.

TK students are learning about animals and their habitats. They are learning about the different characteristics of animals and what they need to survive. TK is learning the letters in their names and practicing how to write their names. They are also working on counting syllables in words.

TK students are learning about shapes. They will learn how to identify, sort, describe, and create 2D shapes.

Students are enjoying getting prepared for all the upcoming holiday activities. In music they have been preparing for their caroling. In the afternoon students have been working hard to learn their lines and roles in this year's play. Our class will be taking part in A Christmas Carol. In math, first graders began Chapter 5 on addition and subtraction relationships. Second graders are working through Chapter 4 on 2-digit addition. As you read aloud for 20 minutes each night, try completing a couple addition and subtraction problems too.

Students worked hard on paragraphs using sensory details about their favorite holidays and are doing a fabulous job reading! Please keep working on those weekly story problems, spelling words, and reading fluencies at home.
