**Title I Information**

Cook Elementary is identified as a Title I school as part of the Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA). Title I is designed to support State and local school reform efforts tied to challenging State academic standards in order to reinforce and enhance efforts to improve teaching and learning for students. Title I programs must be based on effective means of improving student achievement and include strategies to support parental involvement. All Title I schools must jointly develop with all parents a written parental involvement policy. Cook Elementary holds its annual Title 1 Parent Meeting at the beginning of the year.

**School Plan for Shared Student Achievement**

**What is it?** This is a plan that describes how Cook Elementary will provide opportunities to improve parent engagement to support student learning. Cook Elementary values the contributions and involvement of parents in order to establish an equal partnership for the common goal of improving student achievement. This plan describes the different ways that Cook Elementary supports parent engagement and how parents can help plan and participate in activities and events to promote student learning at school and at home.

**How is it developed?** Cook Elementary School welcomes parent input and comments at any time regarding the plan. All parent feedback will be used to revise the plan for next year. The plan is posted on our school website for parents to view and post feedback throughout the year. Parents are invited to a Title 1 informational meeting at the beginning of the year, usually in August. We also distribute an annual survey online and with students to ask parents for their suggestions on the plan and the use of funds for parent involvement.

**Who is it for?** All students participating in the Title I, Part A program, and their families, are encouraged and invited to fully participate in the opportunities described in this plan. Cook Elementary will provide full opportunity for the participation of parents with limited English, parents with disabilities and parents of migratory children.

**Where is it available?** At the beginning of the year the plan is given to all students. Parents can also retrieve a copy of the plan from the secretary at the school or on the school website.
