Practice At Home

- ♦ Read and write together! After your child finishes reading a story, challenge them to add onto their story in writing OR write a retell of the main events. Pay close attention to spelling!
- ♦ For math, practice adding and subtracting numbers using a variety of different strategies. These strategies might include decomposing numbers, using a number line, or drawing the base ten form of the numbers to add or subtract, etc.
- ♦ Challenge your kiddo to measure items around the house using a variety of measurement units. Then, discuss the difference in lengths and widths of those objects.

Practice At Home

Spelling: Make a noun plural by changing the 'y' to an 'i' and adding '-es'. This same rule applies when adding any other suffix starting with a vowel (other than -ing), such as -est, -er, and -ed.

The 'y' does not change to an 'i' if a vowel comes before it in the base word.

Change It: bunny - bunnies, cherry-cherries, happy-happier, study-studied

Don't Change It: day-days, key-keys

Reading: We are picking up where we left off with our pollinator research. We are researching a chosen pollinator and writing paragraphs about what makes them good pollinators.

Math: We are beginning to investigate creating graphs to display data we've gathered.

Science: We will be learning more about properties of materials and applying what we've learned to make a glue
