Superintendent Lisa McCane updated the board on the upcoming Augusta Distillery Field at St. Elizabeth Ball Park Community Day of Auction and Opening Ceremony. Superintendent McCane also reported the district will transition from the CTE Early Childhood and Development Pathway to a Teaching & Learning Pathway in 2024-2025 as part of a grow your own program to address teacher shortages, reported dual credit trends, announced the New Horizon Academy Homeschool Implementation starting in 2024-2025, and provided a legislative update.

4.1. Approve Monthly Budget Report

Rationale:

March 2024 Budget Report

General Fund

Revenue receipts through March totaled nearly \$1,717,000.

Local Revenue: \$300,000 was received in property taxes. \$115,000 was received in utilities tax, while \$85,000 was received in PSC taxes. Nearly \$25,000 was received in motor vehicle taxes. Refund of prior year expenditures accounted for \$7,500 (includes FEMA

payment). \$5,200 was collected for bus rental. \$3,600 was collected for omitted property taxes, with \$3,500 from the sale of surplus equipment. \$2,100 was received in reimbursement of expenses.

State Revenue: \$1,154,000 was received in SEEK funding. \$4,900 was received for revenue in lieu of taxes from the state.

Federal Revenue: Nearly \$6,800 was received for Medicaid reimbursement.

Expenditures through March totaled \$1,663,000.

School Budget: The school budget is \$27,000. \$18,000 was expended through March. Expenses included \$5,100 on the copy-print lease, \$4,400 on technology supplies/subscriptions, \$2,800 on general supplies, \$2,100 on travel expenses, \$1,700 on furniture, and \$1,600 on dues and fees.

Maintenance Budget: Expenses totaled \$320,000 through March. Expenses included \$80,000 on salaries and benefits, \$76,000 on utility services, \$52,000 on property insurance, \$35,000 on repairs and maintenance, \$28,000 in general supplies, \$9,000 on professional services, and \$2,700 on furniture and fixtures. Gymnasium improvements for the new floor, padding, and stage curtains totaled \$37,000. 74% of the maintenance budget has been utilized.

Transportation Budget: Through March, costs totaled \$91,000. Salaries and benefits accounted for \$52,000. \$12,000 has been spent on diesel fuel/gasoline, while \$11,000 has been spent on vehicles. Annual fleet insurance was \$6,400. Vehicle repair and maintenance accounted for \$4,800, while \$4,400 has been expended on repair parts and tires. 54% of the transportation budget has been utilized

For the general fund, year-to-date receipts exceeded expenditures by \$53,000.

Special Revenue Fund

Nothing to report.

Food Service Fund

Revenue: Food service started with a balance of \$66,000. \$181,000 was received in NSLP reimbursement. \$15,000 was received in state revenue. \$8,700 has been collected in local revenue. Food service revenue totaled \$271,000 YTD.

Expenditures: Expenses totaled \$227,000 through March including \$116,000 on food supplies, \$98,000 on salaries and benefits, \$4,400 on furniture and fixtures, \$3,500 on general supplies, \$1,800 for equipment repair, \$1,500 on dues and fees, and \$700 for travel reimbursement.

The food service balance as of March 31 was approximately \$45,000.

4.2. Approve 2024-2025 Technology Plan

Rationale:

The technology plan is required to be approved annually by the Board and highlights technology improvements and needs for the district.

Under the previous plan, successes included successfully transitioning the district to the new ENA Internet service. We continued our refresh strategy of staff and student devices. Teachers reported on the implementation of technology standards, documenting the activities completed to meet those standards.

Major activities slated for implementation in the 2024-2025 plan include two large networking projects that will likely take place, pending E-Rate approval. The district will completely refresh its wireless access points, replace approximately 70% of network switches, along with the Core Router, and replace the fiber connection between buildings. The district will implement a Chromebook replacement plan, as Chromebook devices purchased during the pandemic reach end-of-life. Planning of professional development for Artificial Intelligence will be a focal point, as will be creating guidance for teachers. The district will continue to work to utilize staff to be able to provide technology classes and technology instruction to students to ensure students are proficient in the technology standards.
