### **Proposition 1**

EVALINE REPLACEMENT EDUCATIONAL PROGRAMS AND OPERATIONS LEVY



Levy dollars = Learning!

#### **NOT A NEW TAX**

Every 2 years the district asks voters to replace the previous expiring levy. The district has asked for the same amount of \$190,000 per year since 2009, and is asking for the same amount for the upcoming levy cycle. The expiring local levy averaged a tax rate of \$1.06 per \$1,000 of assessed property value during the last levy cycle. The new levy rate is much lower at \$0.83 per \$1,000, due to the increase in assessed property values. This is the lowest levy rate in Lewis County. The levy funds educational programs and operations not funded or not fully funded by the State, which includes, but is not limited to: non high payments to other districts for Evaline 7-12 grade students, special education programs not funded through basic education, technology equipment and enhancements, security and emergency preparedness, curriculum replacement, staff professional development and training, field trips and field trip transportation, food service, maintenance and operations outside of basic education funding.

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## <u>Kindergarten</u>


