
Honor Society Encourages High Standards








Photographers are irreplaceable, for a picture is worth a thousand words. Mere thanks are hardly enough to express our deep appreciation to our Terry Walden.

You, the students, now hold the result of our year of work in your hands. We hope it has captured those special moments of the 1965 year, which is now to us a wonderful memory.


