Liver and onions, sauerkraut, ribs, sausage patties and link, mashed potatoes and gravy, biscuits, and their famous homemade applesauce are all on the menu each year. This year 300 people were served. This involved 100 pounds of liver, 150 pounds of onion, 150 pounds of sausage links, 200 pounds of sausage patties, two cases of sauerkraut, 30 pounds of sugar, 30 pounds of flour, three gallons of ice cream, 40 pounds of mashed potatoes, and five cases of apples. 




Aaliyah's Recommendation: The Hunger Games


