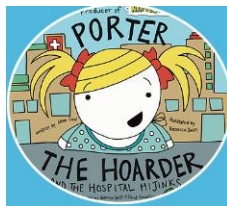

Reading Challenge... Due October 25th

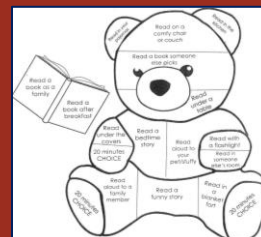
Please participate with your student in these fun reading challenges! Let your student read to you (no matter their age), and they'll get even more excited about reading!

"To help with reading retention, *parents can*: read aloud with their children regularly, ask open-ended questions about the story, encourage re-reading favorite books, connect reading to real-life experiences, have discussions about the characters and plot, and incorporate activities like drawing or acting out scenes to engage their child actively with the text; essentially making reading a fun and interactive experience that promotes deeper understanding and memory retention."
