# CURRICULUM





## Staff Of Fifty-Four Offers One Hundred Twenty-five Courses

The saying "something old something new" pretty well describes this year's curriculum. New courses, new faces and the near completion of a new high school increased possible opportunities for students within the traditional departments. Nine departments with a staff of fifty four offered one hundred twenty-five courses at LWHS.

The **English** curriculum was designed to satisfy the basic needs for skills of communication yet offer a student the opportunity to choose for himself. A wide variety of semester courses were offered to satisfy the requirement that all students study language, literature, composition, and oral skills. Reading lab was a great asset to many students. Since classes were limited in field trips this year, due to the energy crisis, it was not uncommon to see students in classes performing skits and excerpts of plays such as "The Glass Menagerie", "Beowulf" and "Romeo and Juliet". However, honor and drama students did attend the Asolo Theatre presentation of Noel Coward's "Private Lives" in Lakeland at Florida Southern.

Humanities broadened cultural background. **Library** students, who faced an especially difficult year, packed all the volumes and audio-visual equipment for the summer move to the new high school.

The **Drama** department had a most outstanding year with six performances. Their fine efforts were rewarded grandly at an awards banquet.

The **Social Studies** curriculum provided a year of mind prodding experiences. One high point was the honoring of law day. Visiting the county seat, students learned the duties of the county offices and

learned of the officials who hold them.

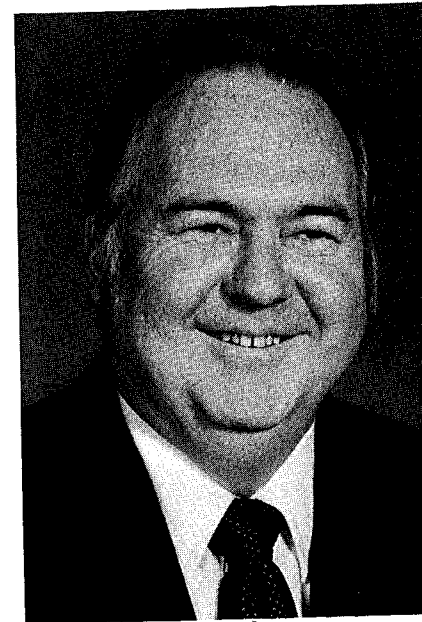
After an orientation session, tenth graders in **Sophomore Seminar** scrutinized the dangers of drugs, debated euthanasia and impeachment, studied first aid and governmental systems.

The **Foreign Language** department added a pretty, young teacher, Miss Holly Knight, teaching both Spanish and French, and adding to class room enthusiasm. Customs and traditions of the nations as well as their language were studied.

Since students have a wide variety of plans for the future college, marriage, or vocational-the **Math** department varied its courses to take care of the needs of each pupil. Pre-College General Math, a new class, was offered for students as preparation for college freshman math.

The **Science** curriculum was expanded also with addition of a new teacher, Mr. Weeks, and a new course, anatomy and physiology. The environmental biology class felt the importance of their research because of the energy crisis that was felt world-wide, threatening to lessen emphasis on ecology.

Placing emphasis on creativity and communication, the **Art** classes worked with ceramics, and painting. The instructor, Mr. Freeman, shared his own work with the Humanities classes, inspiring them to try artistic creation of some sort. Mechanical drawing was taught in **Industrial Arts**. With the help of the coaches, the class constructed hurdles for the track and field teams at a much cheaper price than possible through a dealer. A twenty unit martin house and work on the Lions minstrel set tested all

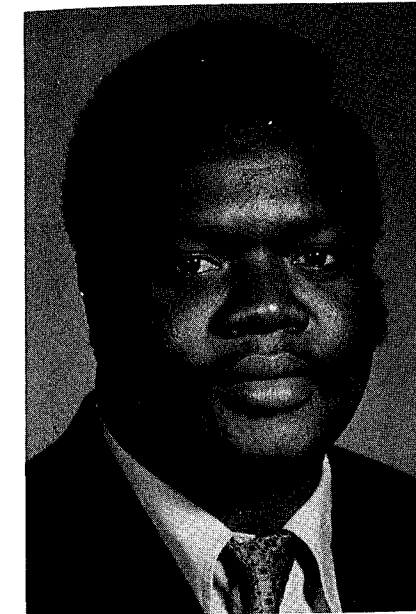
their skills.

As the **Highlander Band** has grown to a total of one hundred twenty-three members, its program has expanded to offer its participants added opportunities. In addition to the concert band and marching band, students could take technique classes or join stage band.

**Chorus** has had a very exciting year, receiving a superior rating at District Chorus Competition. For the first time in six years LWHS was recommended for state where they received an excellent rating. Experimenting with guitars, synthesizers, and autoharps, students found guitar lab a worth while addition to the chorus curriculum.

The **Home Economics** students prepared a wide variety of delicious meals for themselves and some faculty members. Federal programs included curriculum offerings such as tailoring and food management for boys as well as girls.

Horse Production was introduced into the **Agriculture** curriculum and, proving successful, will continue to be an elective for students interested in this field. Many LWHS students won awards



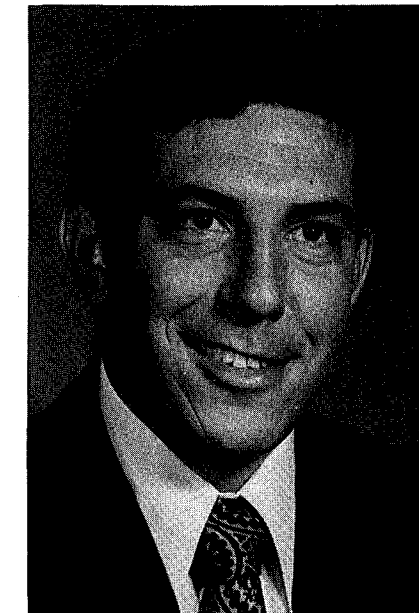

at the Youth Fair, among them, Phylene Howell, placing 2nd with her steer that sold for \$1,226.00. Mr. Lane, the initiator of this course and the founder of the Agriculture department retired after eighteen years at LWHS of diligent dedication to the production of both plants, animals, and growth of character in young men and women.

Preparing students for the drivers' examination, instructors placed special emphasis on drivers' manual in **Driver Education**. But mind and body had to work together when students actually took the wheel to practice the techniques studied from movies and the manual.

For the first time six years, tennis was taught in the girls' **Physical Education** classes. Many students found this the inspiration needed to buy their own equipment and employ their free time investigating this exciting sport.

The students attending **Polk Vocational Technical Center** did a superb job of representing LWHS. We had twenty-eight students enrolled in sixteen different departments. Tim Bush in the Diesel Engines Division won the state

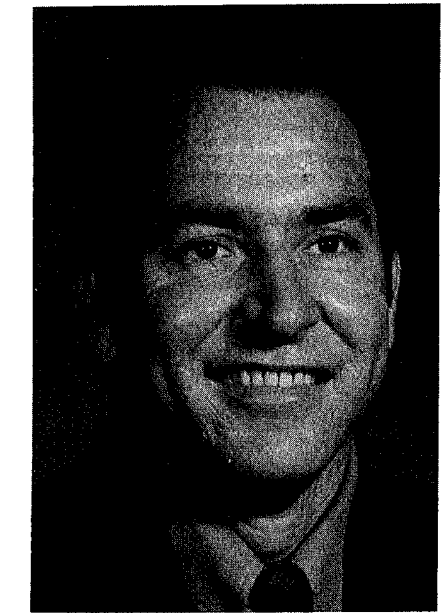

championship and will represent us in the National and International competition.

The **ROTC** program prepared young men and women for good citizenship by teaching self reliance, leadership, respect for authority, military skill, and love of country. This year the entire school was invited to witness the annual inspection, an impressive spectacle.

This year the **Business Education** department enrolled ninety students who together earned approximately \$200,000 in nine months. This department consisted of DCT, CBE, Job Entry, and Work Experience.

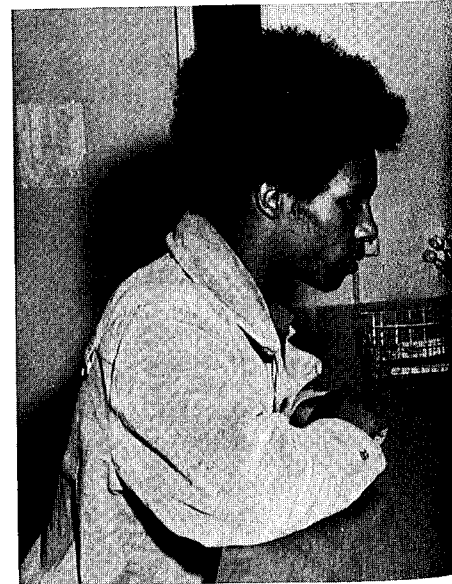
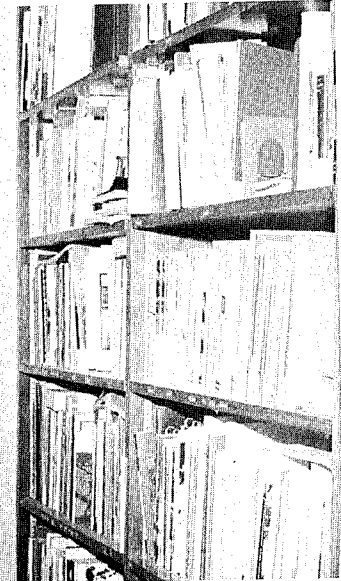
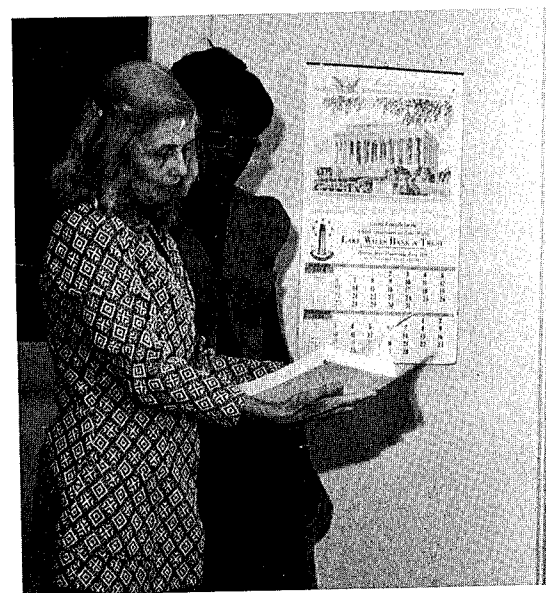
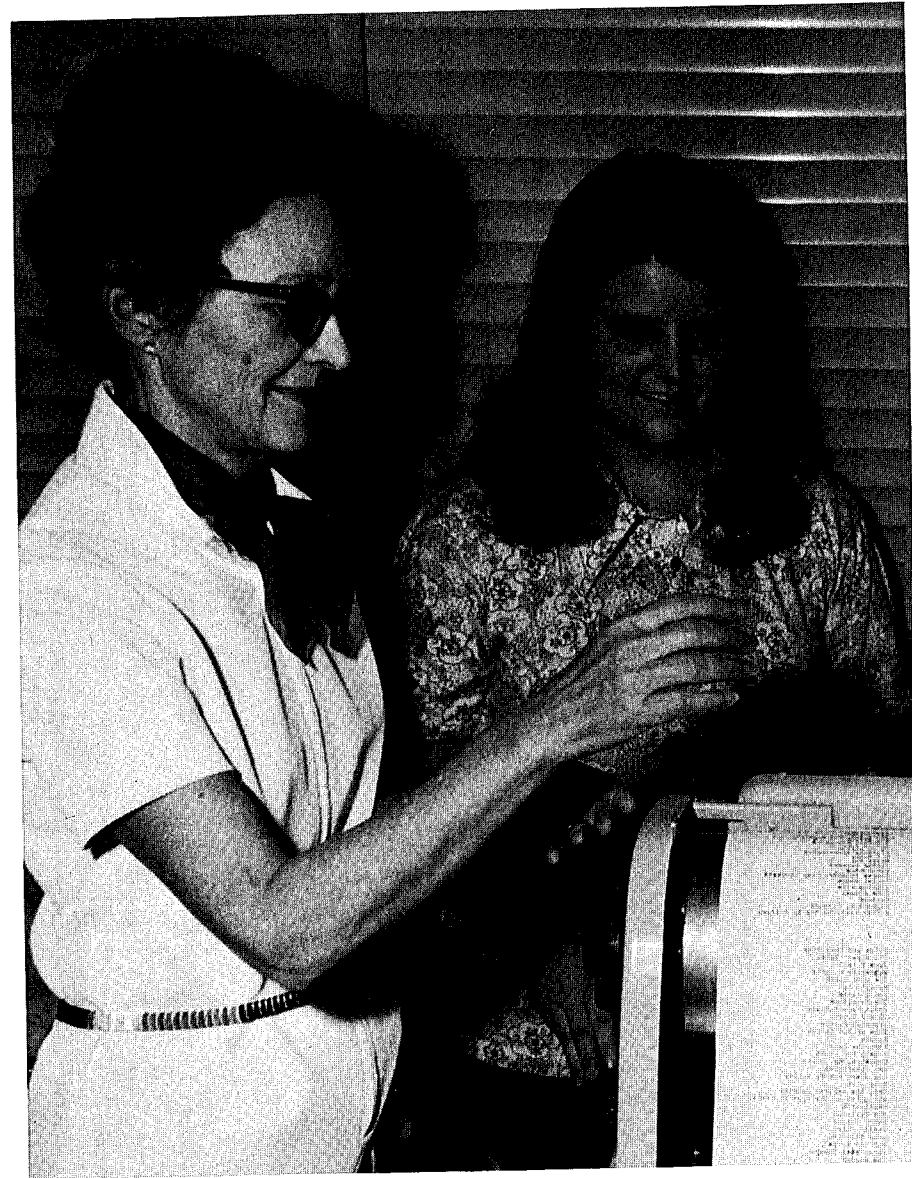

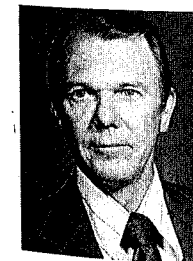

# SENIORS

The Class of Nineteen Hundred and Seventy-Four was the last and largest class, 285 graduates, to graduate from Lake Wales High School at the Seminole Avenue site.

As sophomores, the class endured many days of mocking, ridicule, and harassment. One of the first projects that united them was building the Homecoming Float, which easily won third place. Near the end of the first semester, 1971-72, they began to put their minds to work by joining clubs and realizing the necessity of supporting their high school as well as their class.

Entering what many described as the hardest year, the 1973 Junior Class began with a successful car wash. Next came many time-consuming trips to Citrus World to work on the Homecoming Float, for which again they won third place.

With February, 1973, came many assemblies, the good times and hard work of the magazine sale. To the amazement of the Seniors and with the confidence of their class, the class of 1974 surpassed their goal of \$8,000 by \$78.74. With the funds, the Juniors began to transform the Bartow Civic Center into an "Evening in Paris," the theme of the Prom. Weeks of work preceded the magic night; excitement mounted, climaxing on May 25,

1973. French waiters and waitresses served, and beautiful Can-Can Girls entertained, making the Prom a grand success. Afterwards the guests enjoyed the movie "Bullet" and a hot delicious breakfast prepared by the P.T.A. The last few weeks of school were special weeks for the '73 Juniors. Will Day proved to be embarrassing and funny. Their Senior friends willed them everything from their Senior seat in the auditorium to "special" awards.

As the Honor and Scholarship Awards Day ended, the Juniors began to feel like Seniors, especially as they took possession of the senior section of the auditorium.

In September, 1973, the class arrived in school as full-fledged Seniors. Sophomore eyes glowed in amazement as the Seniors led their roaring cheer in Pep Rallies.

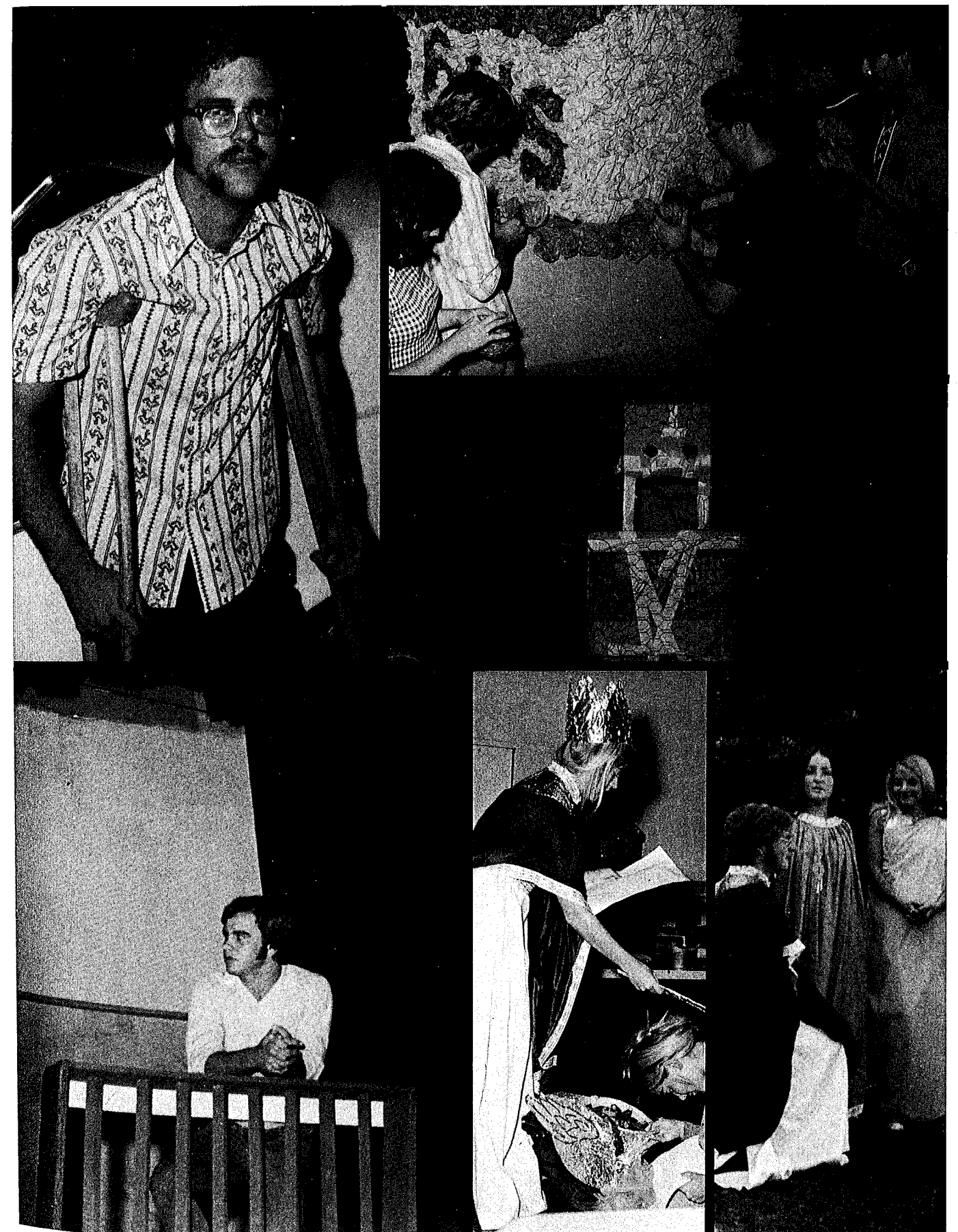
With "Ground the Hounds" as their selected theme, the Seniors worked at Bassett's Barn on their last Homecoming Float. Extra cash from their Junior year provided the funds needed for their winning first place Homecoming Float. The class selected three lovely senior girls as candidates to reign over the Homecoming activities. At pre-game activities, SuSu Jahna was named Homecoming Queen.

As Prom time neared, the Seniors were told of the unique prom to be given as a gift for the last class to

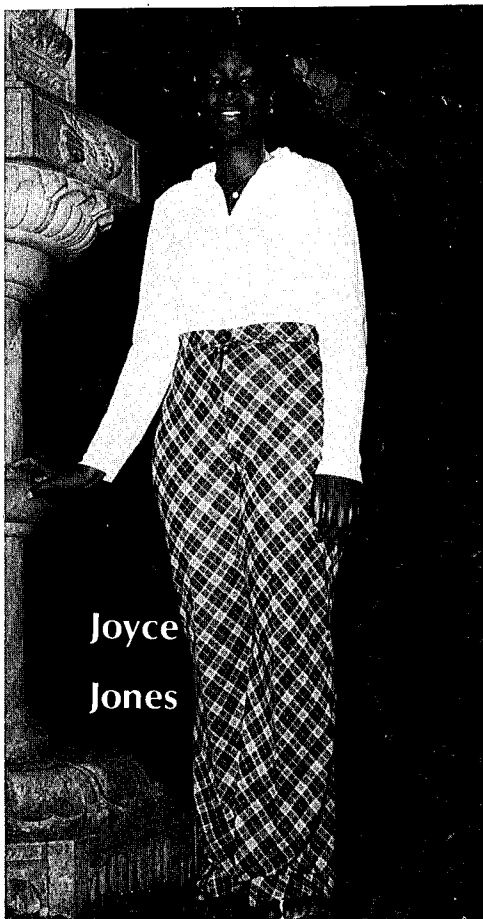
graduate from the old Lake Wales High School. The Contemporary Hotel at Walt Disney was chosen for this spectacular night. When May 3, 1974, arrived, a caravan of cars found their way to Disney World. Guests entering the mirrored ballroom soon realized why the theme, "Wish Upon A Star," was chosen; the room sparkled like a star.

"Senioritis" infected nearly the entire class after prom. June 7, graduation day, seemed too distant to bear. Senior Tea, Tower Day, Senior Picnic, Grad Nite, and an extra week of vacation somewhat eased the pain. Graduation practices at the Passion Play Amphitheatre sapped the energy from perspiring Seniors, but this was pleasant tiredness in the companionship of those that would never again be together in quite the same way.

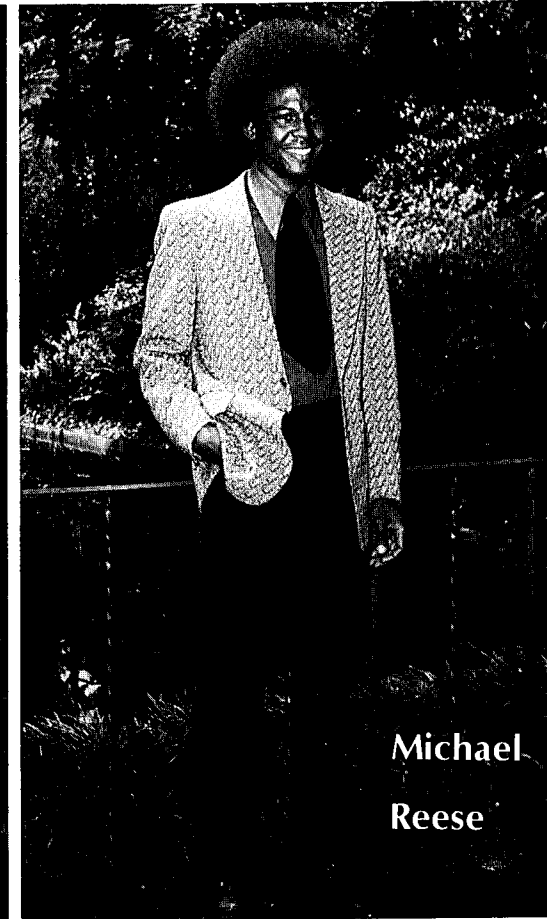
As Graduation Tension mounted, each thrilled when that moment came; a name was called and a diploma was in a waiting hand. Tears flowed or laughter rippled as families and friends celebrated the end of a high school career. But for all, the end was also a new beginning; each would now go his separate way. As the world, nation, city, and students changed so must the high school. But we the students of 1974, and all who have ever learned beneath this roof shall cherish the memories of the old Lake Wales High School.

The sophomores participated in all the homecoming activities with true school spirit. Sara Mott represented the class in the parade, at the pre-game activities, and at the dance.

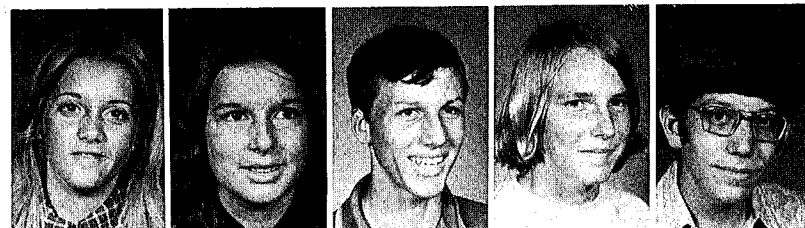

# CHALLENGES



## Highlanders Excel

Lake Wales High School's athletic program boasted a total of eight different sports in 1973-74, including two for women.

The Highlanders had an extremely successful year on the **football** field. Harmonizing excellent athletics skills and quality coaching, the Highlander gridders posted a 9-1 season, the best in a decade. Lake Wales placed 2nd in the South West Florida Conference by whipping such rivals as Sebring and Auburndale, and squeaking past 3rd place Bartow, 27-24. The Highlanders suffered but one defeat this year, that from state AAA champs, Haines City. Completing the season was the traditional Homecoming game, a 39-7 romp over the Auburndale Bloodhounds. The only dark spot of the season occurred against Bartow, when lineman Chuck Simmons suffered a fractured leg, which ended his season.

The offense took the field with a balanced attack this year. The running of Benny Leath, Gator Cherry, and Jeff Boyd, the passing of Doug White, and the receiving of Alan Duncan, Jerzel Black, and Walter Darty combined for an unstoppable scoring punch. Named to the all conference first team was Gator Cherry. Second team all conference honors went to Alan Duncan, Walter Darty, and Richard Lang.

The Highlander defense was outstanding this past year, allowing Auburndale and Tampa Jesuit to gain only 53 yards between them. State champion Haines City was able to gain only 182 yards and score 19 points against the Lake Wales team. All conference first team honors went to Eddie Chadwick, Chuck Jones, and Larry Morris. Ronnie Daniels was placed on the second team.

wick, Outstanding Defensive Lineman; Richard Lang, Outstanding Offensive Lineman; Chuck Jones, Outstanding Lineman; Doug White, Outstanding Offensive Back; Larry Morris, Outstanding Defensive Back; Gator Cherry, Outstanding Back; Roy McPherson, Outstanding Spirit; Edward Lamb, Most Improved; and Cyrus Hawkins, Most Valuable.

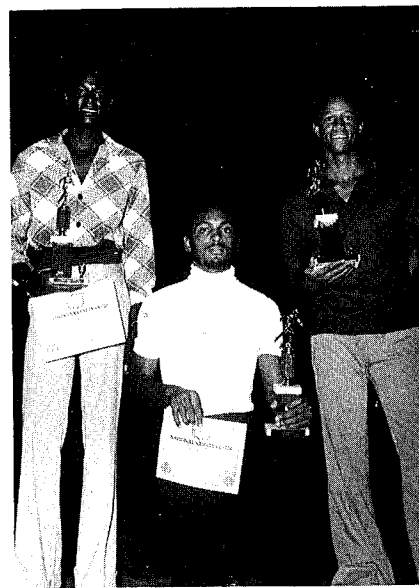

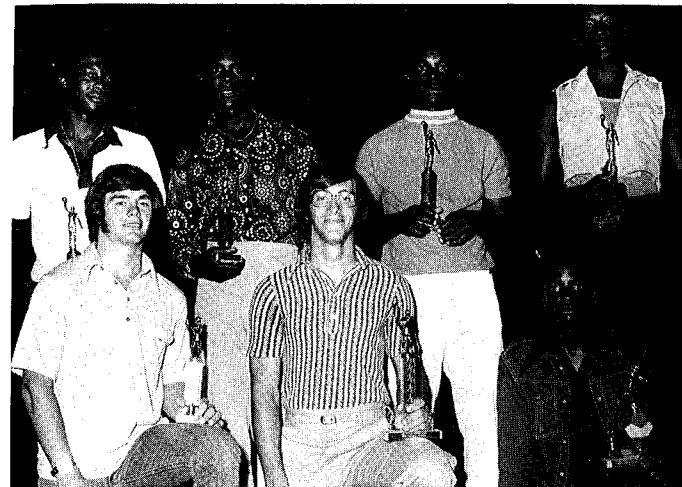

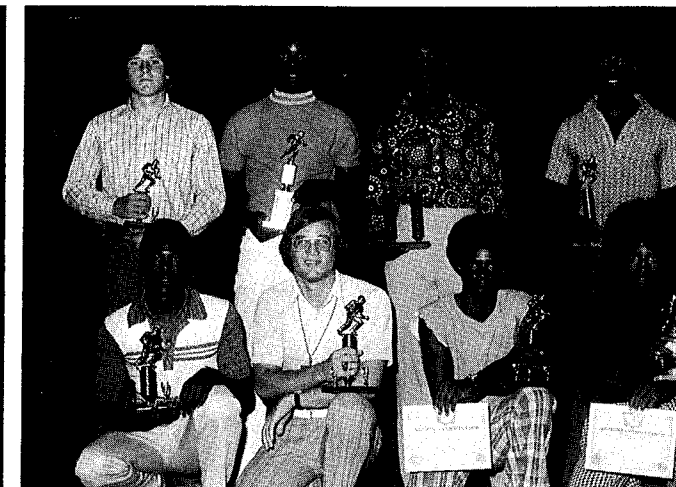

the number one player, was selected by his coach as the Most Valuable.

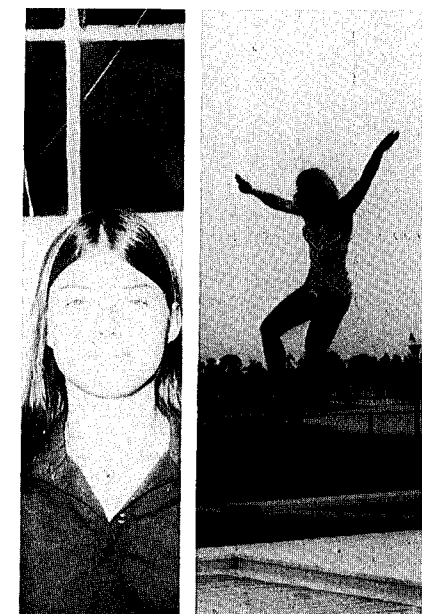

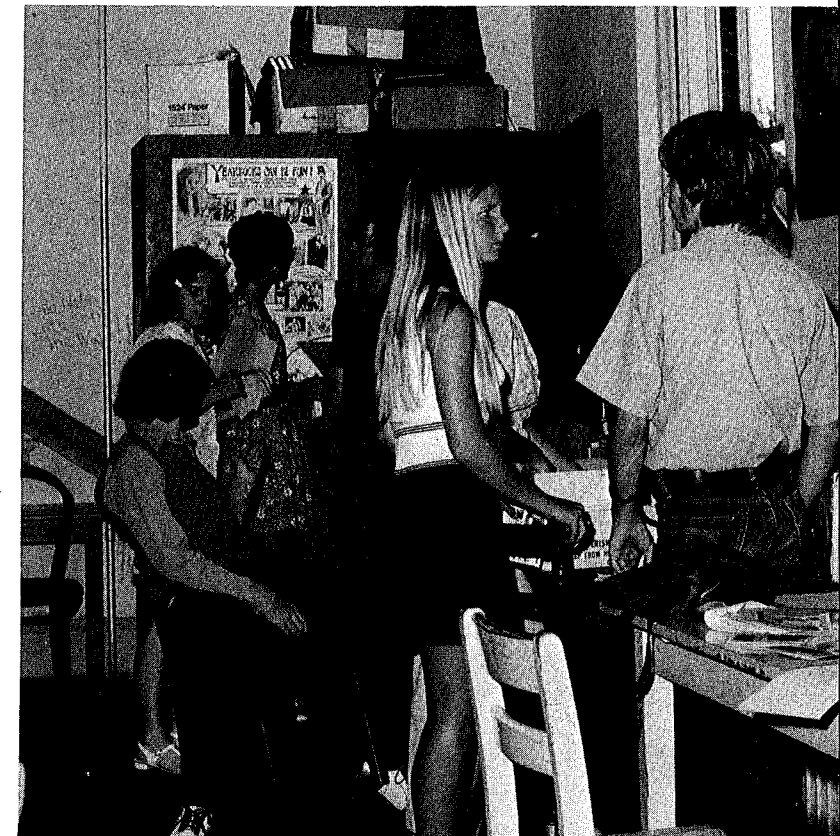

## Closing
