#### Career Corner:

November was full of many great career trips! Students visited the Academy of Media Production (AMP) on November 1. Students on this trip learned about their Photography & Video Production and Recording & Sound Technology Programs. Students also saw inside recording booths and photography studios. On November 7th one group of students participated in the Hospitality Boot Camp while another group attended the Manufacturer's Expo. Students at the Hospitality event learned how to make homemade salsa and ganache and the students at the expo heard from keynote speaker, Master Chief Hiscocks with the US Navy. November 12th was Girl's in STEAM Day hosted by the PA Turnpike. This group of aspiring engineers rotated through sessions learning about storm water management, virtual reality, and drones. A group of students visited Penn State Mont Alto to learn about careers in the forestry industry and see first-hand the opportunities within the Forestry program available at Mont Alto on November 20. In celebration of National Apprenticeship Week the Independent Electrical Contractors (IEC) hosted students at REMCO, Inc. on November 21.
