The Randolph County Board of Education met in a regular monthly session on Tuesday, January 13, 2015 at 6:30 p.m. in the Central Services Boardroom at the 2222 S. Fayetteville Street Office in Asheboro. Tim Moody presented the new "Pride in RCSS" initiative. This initiate is a new way to recognize members of our "RCSS Employee Team" for displaying "pride in the school system" and "high character/high commitment" through their daily efforts. Any RCSS employee can receive a "Pride in the Randolph County School System" pin. The pins will be distributed by members of the Leadership Team, Principals, and Board of Education members. Following Mr. Moody's presentation, Superintendent Stephen Gainey presented each Board of Education member with the first "Pride in the Randolph County School System" pin.

#### **Operations**

1. Recommendation to approve the CDL reimbursements

Marty Trotter shared that RCSS has approximately 825 employees with Commercial Driver Licenses (CDL's). This number includes regular bus drivers, sub drivers, coaches and transportation staff. The NC Department of Motor Vehicles requires bus operators to obtain a Class B CDL with P and S endorsements. It is the recommendation to reimburse employees for their CDL expense following 12 months of Randolph County School System service. Mr. Trotter shared the annual expense is estimated at \$16,000. This expense will be covered with savings generated from the new GPS systems that were approved at the December Board of Education meeting. After review and discussion, Emily Coltrane made a motion and the motion was seconded by Matthew Lambeth to approve the recommendation of the CDL reimbursements and to begin with those issued on or after February 1, 2015.

# **Seagrove Elementary School Property**

Tracy Boyles made a motion and Gary Cook seconded the motion to declare the land described more thoroughly in Attachment 1, located on the campus of Seagrove Elementary School on Old Plank Road in Seagrove, North Carolina, as surplus property, pursuant to N.C.G.S. §115C-518, for the reasons stated in the Statute, and direct the superintendent and our attorneys and staff to

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follow the disposal procedures required by law, including offering the land to the Board of County Commissioners. The motion was passed unanimously.

Because the Commissioners have determined at a meeting on January 5, 2015 that they do not intend to purchase the land for fair market value, Fred Burgess made a motion and Matthew Lambeth seconded the motion that the Board of Education accept the offer of the land owners of the property described in Attachment 2, who are Brooks, Routh and Maness, in exchange for the property described in Attachment 1, and that our attorneys and staff be directed to follow the process described in G.S. §160A-271 to effectuate the land exchange. The motion was passed unanimously.

The superintendent shared that the resolution will now sit for ten days and without any conflicts, the resolution will appear as an action item at the February 16, 2015 Board of Education meeting.

# Adjournment

Matthew Lambeth made a motion and the motion was seconded by Brian Biggs to adjourn the meeting. The motion passed unanimously and the meeting was adjourned at 7:35 pm.
