

Senior Corner

SCHOLARSHIPS: Seniors have been ceiving information via email about our local scholarships. We will go over the best way to fill out the scholarships, writing their scholarship letters, and how to put them together. All local scholarships are listed on our website. Filling out scholarships is a long, and sometimes complicated process. Parents, please make sure you are communicating with your child and guiding them through this process. If you have any questions regarding scholarships, please email Mrs. Robinson.

SENIOR PROJECTS: We kicked into high gear starting in January on senior projects. We will be working on our research/poster development, and will start the process of writing our paper. Presentations will be in May, but there are many deadlines students will need to meet along the way.

RUNNING START STUDENTS – Running Start students have been sent an email with their requirements. REMEMBER: contact Mr. Shepherd, Mrs. Robinson, or Mrs. Schimelpfenig if you have any questions.

JOB SHADOWS: Parents, please be talking with your child about job shadows. It is impossible to pass the senior project without their 3 required (12 hours) job shadows. Remember the teachers and staff will assist seniors in this process if they need help. Their job shadow information is the base of their paper and presentation. The rough draft of the paper is due at the beginning of April, and all job shadows should be completed by then in order to have a complete paper.

FAFSA (Financial Aid) - We will continue working with students filling out the FAFSA application. **REMEMBER:** ALL STUDENTS THAT PLAN OR EVEN THINK THEY WILL BE ATTENDING COLLEGE NEED TO APPLY FOR FAFSA.




Yearbook prices are now \$35 each or two for \$60. We only order a certain amount of yearbooks, so buy your yearbook before they are all out.

PE ELL FACILITIES UPDATE

Pe Ell School Facilities Update

School Safety Projects

The **Enclosed Canopy Project** is nearing completion. This project, in conjunction with the recently completed **Key Fob Project**, will make our school safer by limiting exposure of our students to the outside during the school day and limiting access to the building aside from the designated entry (the right-side cafeteria entrance doors). It is an unfortunate reality that schools need to increase safety measures for all; these two projects will do that. <u>Timber dollars from debt service are financing this project</u>.

Concession Stand Project

This project was proposed in the last two bond measures. It has been a hope for 30 years! The school board made this a priority, and it is going to happen this year. The stand will include bathrooms. Design plans are complete, permitting is being submitted, and the project is out for bid. A construction start of Spring 2024 is anticipated with substantial completion in August of 2024. Timber dollars from debt service are financing this project.

Bond Measure

The Pe Ell School Board of Directors set aside time in their August, September, October, and November regular meetings for discussion and public input about a bond. They decided to run a bond that will become active when the current bond expires. The measure for a \$1.9M bond, if passed, will support the modernization project by improving our outside areas and other items not covered by state grants. A new bond would allow timber dollars to continue flow into debt service for other future facility improvements and to lower taxes.

Bond items include: track replacement with football field improvements and irrigation, temporary classrooms for displaced classes during construction activities (portables), other site upgrades including school and youth ball fields, and some finances for overall project planning and unforeseen building costs.

Modernization of School Project

<u>Finances:</u> Rural Modernization Grant I (\$5M) is funded through construction. Rural Modernization Grant II (\$6M)— is funded through planning, with construction funding anticipated no later than July 2025. Rural Modernization Grant III (\$6M)— Application to apply has been opened and will be reviewed for submission. SCAP (School Construction Assistance Program) will be applied for no later than Fall 2024.

<u>Scope of work:</u> Whole building modernization including upgrades to building envelope (roofing, siding, doors, windows), safety and security, heating and cooling, plumbing and electrical, interior finishes, classroom technology, and furnishings.

<u>Timeline:</u> Advertisement for architectural and engineering services is posted with final review and selection of a design team to take place in February of 2024. The design phase is anticipated to start Winter 2024 and extend through June of 2025. The bid phase is Summer 2025 (estimated) with a construction start of Summer/Fall 2025 (estimated).
