What is a Title I School?



• The purpose of Title I is to ensure that all children have a fair, equal, and significant opportunity to obtain a high-quality education. Our goal is to ensure achievement through challenging state academic achievement standards and assessments.

• We are a School-Wide Title I program. We utilize a comprehensive reform model to assist ALL students but particularly the lowest achieving children to meet state academic standards.



What is the purpose of Title I Schools?





• The purpose of Title I under ESSA is to, "ensure that all children have a fair, equal, and significant opportunity to obtain a high-quality education and reach at a minimum, proficiency on challenging state academic achievement standards and assessments."

- A Title I School works to:
 - Identify students most in need of educational help.
 - Set goals for improvement.
 - Measure student progress and develop programs that add to classroom instruction.
 - Involve parents in all aspects of the program.





How are Title I funds spent?

- An extra classroom teacher
- Educational Coach
- Two Intervention Paraprofessionals

- Reading Programs

Law Requirements for Parent and Family Engagement:

The law requires a 1% set-aside of Title I Funds to be allocated for a District Parent and Family Engagement Coordinator.

What is the purpose of testing?

- The Georgia student assessment program is designed to measure student achieve relative to the state-mandated content standards. The purpose of testing is to:
 - Identify students failing to achieve mastery of content
 - Provide teachers with diagnostic information
 - Assist schools in identifying strengths and weaknesses in order to establish priorities in planning educational programs.
