Attendance

- Assessments give us vital information about your students' progress and the next best steps for their instruction.
- Students usually do their best work when they follow their normal routine.
- Students miss instruction when they have to make up an assessment.

Common Formative and Summative Assessments



- These classroom assessments are some of the most important assessments your student takes-giving us vital information about grade level standards mastery.
- Formative assessments give us information about how students are doing during a unit of instruction so we can adjust instruction and support.
- Summative assessments are unit tests; students get Tier 2 instruction in reading and math for essential standards that are not mastered on these important assessments.

- Progressions are assessed year-round
- We assess in ELA, Math, and Foundations of School Success
- Different domains in each section, all to be assessed at different points in the year
- Range from Not Yet Demonstrating to Exceeding
- Goal is for students to be performing at Demonstrating level by the end of the year

MAP Fluency

MAP reading fluency is an online adaptive reading assessment for students in grades K-5 who are learning to read. It measures foundational reading skills, with an emphasis on oral fluency.

The assessment will begin with foundational skills:

- Listening Comprehension
 - Picture Vocabulary
- Phonological Awareness
- Phonics/Word Recognition
- Sentence Reading Fluency

If applicable, the student will move on to oral reading which includes:

- Oral Reading Rate
 - Accuracy
- Oral Reading Level
 - Literal Comprehension

It will give scores for each section.

MAP Growth

- Math and Reading assessment that tracks a student's academic growth and achievement.
- It measures what students know and what they are ready to learn.
- Students are tested 3 times a year. (August, January, and March)
- Students and teachers work together to set goals based on student performance.

MAP Math and Reading

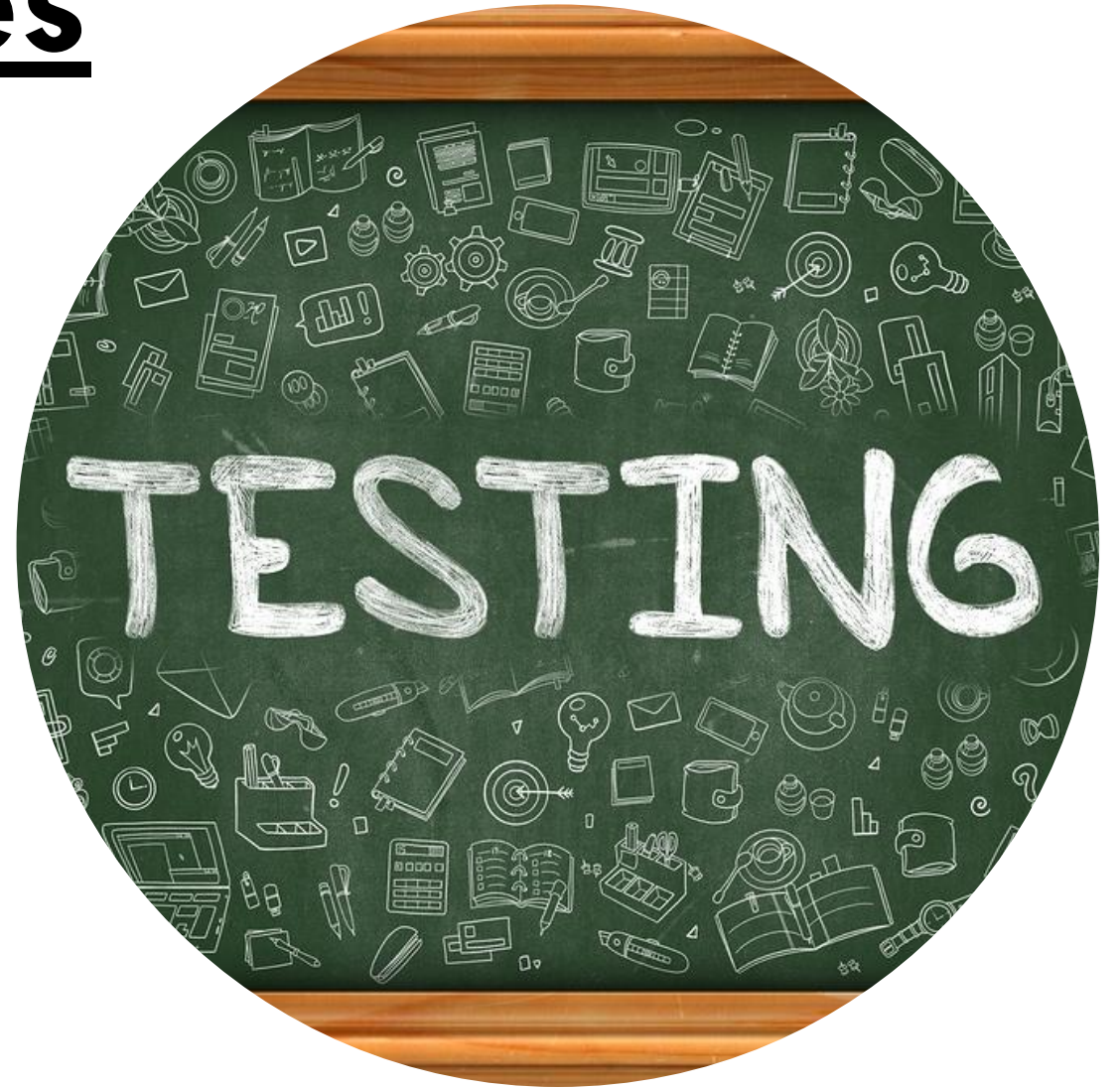
Percentiles

- Growth Percentiles: Used to monitor and track if students are making progress at their individual level.
- Achievement Percentiles: Used to monitor and track if students are meeting grade level expectations.
- The achievement percentile shows how students perform based on other students in the same grade level.

Georgia Milestones

- Given in April and/or May
- 3rd, 4th, 5th Grade
- Computer Based
- Measures their proficiency of grade level standards

- Class Dojo is a reporting tool that can be used in any class or grade level used to connect parents and teachers through personal messages as well as whole class stories.
- Provides instant communication between home and school.
- Allows for teachers and parents to interact individually and with the whole class.
- Classroom teacher has a code unique to their class.
- Points given in grades first through fifth dependent on students behavior, students earn points to participation in PBIS celebrations.
- App available for IOS and Android.

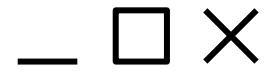


# Internet Safety

- Purpose of informational technology is to facilitate communication in support of research and education. The Georgia Computer Systems Protection Act specifically forbids computer misuse and abuse.

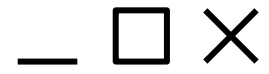


# Internet Safety



Refer to Elementary School Student Handbook for information regarding Internet and Electronic Devices >>>>>

- Users will not post, publish, send or intentionally receive offensive messages, or pictures from any source, including but not limited to an defamatory, inaccurate, abusive, obscene, ...or illegal material.
- Posting messages and attributing them to another user is prohibited.
- Students must receive permission from a teacher or designated personnel prior to accessing the Internet or any other specific file or application.
- Any student who identifies a security problem must notify an adult teacher, supervisor, or administrator immediately.



# Copyright Piracy



\*Title I schools must provide information and resources to help families work with their children to understand the harms of copyright piracy.

## Copyright Piracy Awareness Notification

Title I, Part A, Section 1116 of the Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA) states that Title I schools shall provide information and resources to help parents and families work with their children to understand the harms of copyright piracy. In keeping with this requirement, definitions of relevant terms as well as links to websites that may be helpful in educating children concerning copyright piracy regulations are included below.

\*Copyright - a form of protection given to creators and authors of literary, dramatic, musical, and artistic works. The author has the right to let others make copies, distribute copies, perform work publicly, display work publicly, and make modifications or adaptations.

**Copyright**-a form of protection given to creators and authors of literary, dramatic, musical and artistic works. A copyright means that the author has the right to do or let other do any of the following things:

- Make copies
- Distribute copies
- Perform work publicly
- Display work publicly
- Make modifications or adaptations

\*It is illegal for anyone to do any of the things listed above without the creator's permissions. However, there are some exceptions and limitations to this right. One major limitation is the Doctrine of Fair Use.

**Copyright Piracy**-Unauthorized reproduction for sale or use of a copyrighted work such as a book, lyric or software.

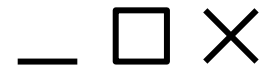

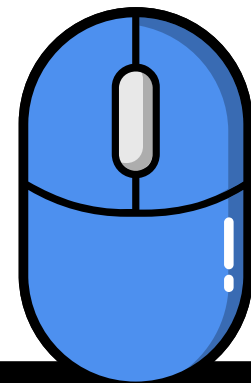
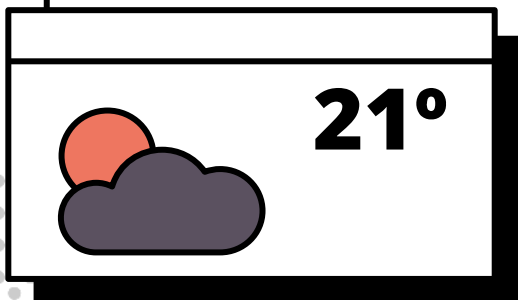
