## Mrs. Hanna's TK-3rd Grades



Memorial Day is here! We are remembering in class that it's a day to remember and honor those who died in service to our country. It's a time to remember their bravery and dedication to our freedom. It's about the importance of remembering those who served and died, and the sacrifices their families made. We are grateful! What did you all do on Memorial Day?

In history this week, we are learning about the past and comparing it to the present. What was it like living 150 years ago? How much did people work? Were there things that took longer to accomplish and finish then they do now? A lot of questions and a lot of interesting things to discover. Another subject from the past are machines. What did people use machines for 150 years ago compared to what we use machines for now? What has technology given to us? How has it changed life? It's interesting to know how communication has changed over the years and even how we used to cook/eat and how we have our meals now. What is different, what is the same? Is our life better with all this convenience? So many things to talk about and discuss. We do enjoy living in this day and age!

In science, we are still learning about electricity. Last week we learned about static electricity and this week we are learning about an electric current, the kind of electricity that flows in our house and makes our appliances work. We use so much electricity every day. We had many stories of what we did when we didn't have electricity! Can we live without electricity? Of course we can! But it sure is nice to have it. In math, there are many different things happening. Kindergarten is learning about positions. Is it next to? Is it beside, in front of something or behind something. Is it above something or below something? First grade is carrying on with fractions and learning about equal and unequal parts. Fractions using 1/2 and 1/4. and how many equal a whole shape. Second grade is learning more about time; the difference between a.m. and p.m. and elapsed time. How long does it take to do something and how do you calculate it? Third grade is also continuing on with telling time. They are also measuring -whether it's inches or centimeters. Next they will be introduced to mass - whether it's grams or kilograms, liters or milliliters. In language arts, kindergarten is learning about synonyms and antonyms. What are they and how do we use them? First grade is learning about prefixes and suffixes. How do we build them and how do we take them apart and which are correct? Second grade is learning about comparative adjectives. Do you use young, younger or youngest? Compound words are discussed in third grade as well as continuing on with comparative adjectives, just like second grade, but a little bit more advanced. They are also going to be learning about comparative adverbs as well and starting on subject and object pronouns. So many, many skills to learn.

They are all doing so well and have come so far this year. I am quite proud of all of them and what they've accomplished. It has been such a great year! Well done!

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
