The Archdale-Trinity community is a rapidly growing area with a current population of approximately 17,000. We are located in the northwest region of Randolph County, due south of High Point in the Piedmont Triad area. Trinity High is one of eight high schools in the Randolph County School System.

### **School History**

Trinity High School has a vast history dating back to 1832. In 1859, Trinity College was established under the supervision of Dr. Craven, who served as President of Trinity College until his death in 1882. In 1891, Trinity College established a high school that operated out of the same building as the college. One year later, Trinity College was moved to Durham and the high school got sole use of the building. Trinity High's campus has expanded from a four-building complex in 1969 to the current ten-building complex.
