Community Involvement in Plan Development

A committee for the Continuous Improvement Plan is used at the beginning of each school yea. This committee starts meeting in June. Section V: Report of Progress Narrative (required)

Dietrich Schools has seen a lot of success in meeting targets in the 2022-23 school year based on the goals that we set for our district. The implementation of the Reading Intervention program at the Elementary in grades K-6 has had a huge impact on our Istation scores at the K-6 level. We exceeded by 20% all of our target goals in Literacy. Our biggest challenge in ELA is at the middle school level. Our 7th and 8th grade students scored well below the target goals as well as below the state average. We have much higher expectations for our students. This year we are implementing a writing portfolio K-12 to help with the ELA scores at the secondary level as we have identified writing as a big weakness for our secondary students. In addition to the writing portfolio, we are also incorporating writing prompts into our advisory class one time a week. We believe we will see huge gains in our ISAT and SAT scores at the secondary level with the amount of emphasis that we are putting on writing in each classroom at the secondary level. Another challenge is our Math ISAT scores at the 7-9th grade levels. We believe this is largely due to the amount of turnover we have had in math teachers at the secondary level. The new math teacher this year is incorporating many things to help fill the gaps these students have. Interim ISAT assessments will be used at all levels Math ELA and Science. As a district, we have set individual and district goals to aid in the improvement of our challenge areas in ELA and Math. We are excited to see the improvement our students make this school year.
