#### Deadlines/Late Work:

All tasks are to be on the assigned due date. Students are responsible for meeting deadlines and should stay organized to avoid negligence and/or forgetfulness. Students should not expect to have unexcused late work accepted without penalty (10 points per day late).

**Electronics:** Students are expected to use technology, completed and turned in namely Chromebooks/laptops, responsibly and at the teacher's discretion. Students, as young scholars and emerging professionals, are expected to communicate clearly and respectfully both in person and when sending emails, messages, etc. Inappropriate and unauthorized use of any device will result in disciplinary action. Cell phones, specifically, should be silenced and not visible during instructional time.

#### **Academic Integrity:**

Students are expected to do their part in upholding the integrity of the course. Students should put forth their best effort, complete tasks without unauthorized assistance (i.e. no cheating—will result in a zero), and use class time to complete assignments (i.e. no "self-assigning" homework).

Makeup Work: Students are responsible for obtaining and completing makeup work in a timely fashion (handbook specifies 10 days) when absent. Lesson plans for each day are located on the school's website and on Schoology. Assignments and materials, depending on their nature, will be available on Schoology and/or in the physical classroom.

- 2. Be PREPARED. Being prepared to start class means you've handled all personal business before the tardy bell, you've brought all needed supplies to class, and you've started the Bell Ringer without being prompted.
