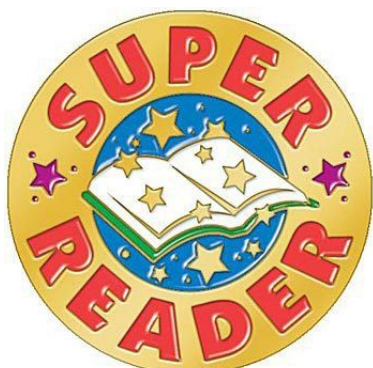

We are learning letter sounds again! Students learned about the letters b, l, and r. We are also starting to practice writing the sounds we hear instead of finding the card that matches the sound. We continue to work on identifying fiction stories. Students can identify what clues in the story that help them know if the story is fiction. Students are also reading BOB books to help reinforce the sounds they are learning. A couple of students are really working on getting to the next level. After students finish each level, they will get a prize.

This week students are starting a new unit in science, forces and interactions. We started the unit by exploring the concept of level and mass using balances.



3rd graders moved on to their new unit in math where they are using manipulatives to begin to see the relationship between multiplication and division. The Fourth graders are still needing extra time with their long division skills so we will spend time over the next two weeks practicing our long division, reviewing multi-digit multiplication and working on multi-step story problems.
