School Counseling Update – December 2022-January 2023

SECOND SEMESTER SCHEDULES

Second semester schedules will not be printed for students. Please check Synergy to review the 2nd semester schedule. It is the responsibility of the student/parent to review the schedule and if an error/missing period is found to submit a “schedule change request form” to the counselor no later than Friday, December 9, 2022. **Teacher or lunch changes cannot be honored.**

It is important that all students clear their obligations from 1st semester (class fees, sports, lost textbooks, damages etc.) before leaving for Winter Break. First semester report cards will be distributed to students on Monday, January 9, 2023. Payment for 2nd semester fee-based classes must be made **after** you return from break and recommended before January 27, 2023. Second semester fees **cannot** be paid prior to January 9, 2023.

COUNSELING OFFICE ACTIVITIES

During October and November through the Social Studies classes, counselors are meeting with 10th, 11th, and 12th graders to review their ECAP (Education Career Action Plan).

Parents: We encourage you to have a conversation with your student about ECAP. Future planning is critical to ensure that students meet graduation requirements, have knowledge about programs of study and are able to pursue their post-secondary goals. Your involvement is extremely important!

FINAL EXAM STUDY TIPS

Final Exams will be given Tuesday – Thursday, December 20th- 22nd. Final exams are worth 20% of the semester grade. Make sure that you're checking ParentVue to keep up with your grades. (If you haven't received log on information for ParentVue, please contact the **Counseling Office**.) Take advantage of these study tips to help ensure that your student is better prepared in order to do well on his/her final exam. Good Luck!

- ⇒ **Manage your time.** Study your hardest subjects first. Make studying a priority over other activities.
- ⇒ **Take notes written in class and rewrite them at home (most copies are available on Google Classroom).** Make flashcards, visual aids, or highlight important points to help you remember. Using your notes or flashcards, quiz yourself or have someone else quiz you. Repetition is the key.
- ⇒ **Read your notes to your parents and “teach” them the material.** If you get stuck on something make sure you ask your teacher about it the next day.
- ⇒ **Re-read the chapters and the chapter reviews.**
- ⇒ **Get a good night's sleep:** Don't stay up all night studying the night before.
- ⇒ **Do not wait until the last minute to study.** Study a little bit every night for several nights before the test. Don't cram!
- ⇒ **Find a good place to study.** It should be quiet and free of distractions. No TV or social media!
- ⇒ **Eat a light and nutritious meal** sometime before the test. Avoid junk food!
- ⇒ **Stay relaxed;** take soft deep breaths.
- ⇒ **Think positive thoughts** such as “I can do this.”

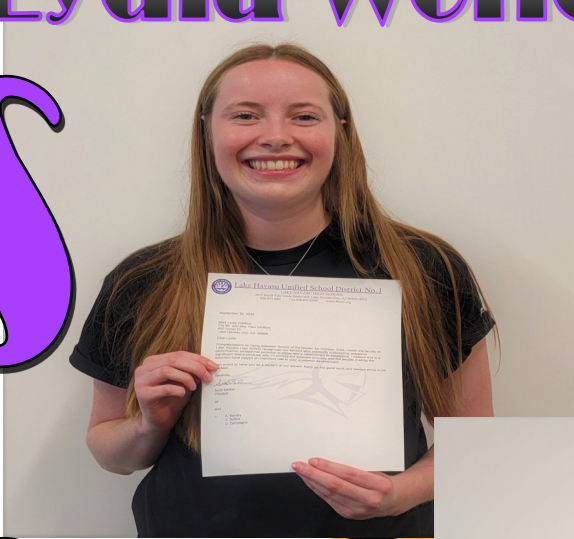
AZ @ Work helps students with career exploration, internships, skills, training as well as funding. AZ @ Work has started their 5 workshop series for Work Readiness at LHHS.

I have lived in Lake Havasu for 2 months.

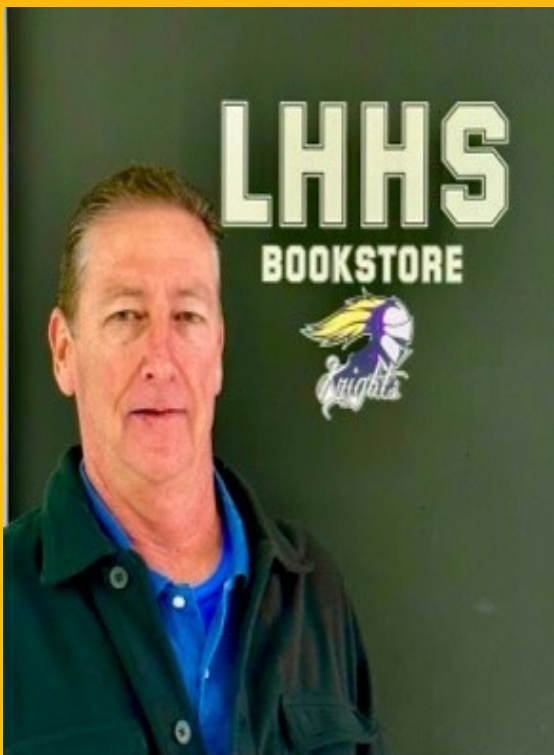
I was born and raised in Hamilton, Ohio which is approx. 1 hour North of Cincinnati.

During the week of Día de los Muertos, Mrs. Aispuro Spanish classes celebrated in making Alebrijes. Alebrijes are brightly colored Mexican folk art sculptures of imaginary creatures. The first Alebrijes originated with Pedro Linares in the 1930s, when he dreamt of strange animals. He dreamed of a donkey with butterfly wings, a rooster with bull horns, a lion with an eagle head, and all of them were shouting one word, "Alebrijes." He began recreating the creatures he saw in cardboard and paper-mâché and called them Alebrijes.

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Alebrije sculptures are traditionally carved from wood or made with paper mâché.

According to the legend, animals play an important role in many Mexican traditions, including Dias de Los Muertos. Alebrijes are "spirit animals" that guide the spirits of ancestors on their journey. They are represented in Mexican folk art.

Her students became very involved in this project and every student chose their animal. Along with making their Alebrije they each wrote a small piece about what this animal represents for them.

Alebrijes were displayed in the library for all to enjoy these wonderful creations that all Spanish classes made.
