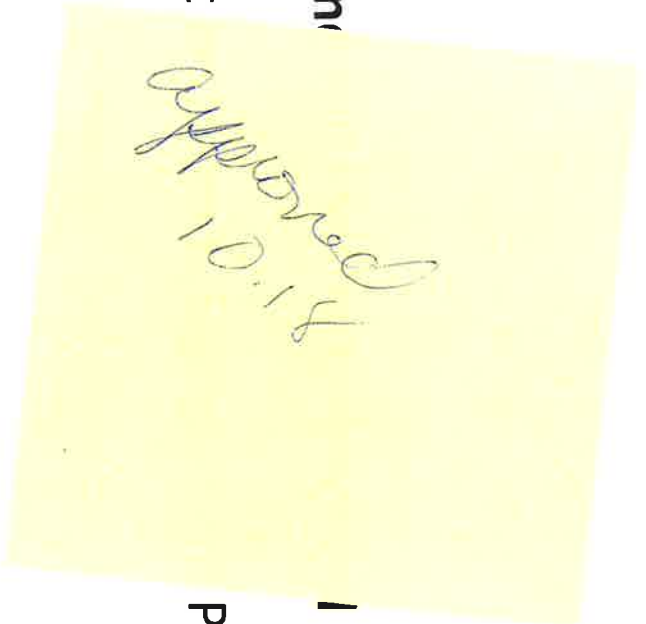

What is Title I?

Sand Hill Elementary is identified as a Title I school as part of the Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA). Title I is designed to support State and local school reform efforts tied to the challenging State academic standards to improve teaching and learning for students. Title I programs must be based on effective means of improving student achievement and include strategies to support family engagement. All Title I schools must jointly develop with parents and family members a written parent and family engagement policy.

School Plan for Shared Student Achievement

What is it?

This is a plan that describes how Sand Hill Elementary will provide opportunities to improve family engagement to support student learning. Sand Hill Elementary values the contributions and involvement of parents and family members to establish an equal partnership for the common goal of improving student achievement. This plan describes the different ways that Sand Hill Elementary will support family engagement and how parents can help plan and participate in activities and events to promote student learning at school and at home.

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How is it revised?

Sand Hill Elementary School invited all parents to participate in providing input meeting in the months of August 2023 and September 2023. We will also request input during our yearly annual Title I meetings at which time we review and revise this parent and family engagement policy, as well as building staff capacity, our school-parent compact, and the family engagement budget. Additionally, parent input and comments regarding this plan are welcome during the school year through an online form. The plan is posted on our school website for parents to view and submit feedback throughout the year. All parent feedback received during the year will be used to revise the plan for the next school year. We also distribute an annual survey online and by mail to ask parents for their suggestions on the plan and the use of funds for family engagement. Parents and family members can also give feedback during several parent meetings and activities during the school year including our annual Community Cares event. Who is it for?

All students participating in the Title I, Part A program, and their families are encouraged and invited to fully participate in the opportunities described in this plan. Sand Hill Elementary will provide full opportunity for the participation of parents and family members with limited English, with disabilities, and of migratory children.

2023-2024 District Goals

The percentage of students scoring Proficient and distinguished on the Georgia Milestones (GMAS) by three percent and increase the percent of EL, ED, and SWD scoring proficient and distinguished on the Georgia Milestones (GMAS) by six percent.

2023-2024 School Goals

Meet or exceed state average in Georgia Milestones state assessment in ELA and increasing the Reading/ELA and Math scores in the GMAS by 3%.

We will do this by providing ELA and Reading support in the area of ELA by implementing the Science of Reading. This includes a focus area of Phonics in K-2, Early Literacy in 1-3 and Literacy in 4-5 with a focus of comprehension skills and understanding. Along with tutors to work with at risk students we also are also introducing daily ELT, where students will work within their academic reading level for 40 minutes daily.

The focus area for Math will be on Math reasoning skills. These skills correlate with the work in daily literacy skills. SHE will also provide tutored instruction 2 to 4 times a week if needed with the use of hired tutors that work 3-4 hours daily and tutors that are available after school.

School-Parent Compacts

As part of this plan, Sand Hill Elementary and our families will develop a school-parent compact, which is an agreement that parents, teachers, and students will develop that explains how parents and teachers will work together to make sure all our students reach grade-level standards. The compacts will be reviewed and updated annually based on feedback from parents, students, and teachers during the next parent meeting. The school-parent compacts are also sent home with each student and a School Parent Compact agreement is signed by students, parents and the teacher.

- ✓ Communicate with all families and the community on a regular basis regarding schoolwide events and activities, through phone messages, social media, and flyers.
- ✓ Work with our parents to develop relevant trainings and helpful presentations to educate our staff on the importance of parent and family engagement and how to support student learning.
- ✓ Provide necessary materials and handouts for parents at conferences, meetings, and activities to help parents work with their child to improve their child's achievement.
- ✓ Use our Partners in Education and School-Community Team to improve awareness of the activities and events listed in the school parent and family engagement policy.
