 - Parents are required to attend a minimum of two parent-teacher conferences per year. During these meetings, ACAP/state testing results will be reviewed.
 - At least one conference will be scheduled to take place during first semester, and another during second semester.
 - Utilize student communication folders/notebooks to effectively communicate with parents regarding academic growth, attendance, and behavior.

- Progress reports will be sent home at mid-quarter each quarter.
- Weekly reports will be sent from Schoology.
- Parents may also log-into PowerSchool and/or Schoology to check student grades. Notification of access codes will be distributed at the beginning of the school year.
- 4. Provide parents reasonable access to staff. Specifically, staff will be available for consultation with parents as follows:
 - Teachers may be contacted by sending a note to the teacher, email, class messaging, or by calling the school office at 251-221-1285. During class time, messages taken in the office are delivered to the teacher's mailbox.
 - Teachers can meet with parents for a conference before school, after school, or during their planning period, depending on their schedule.
- 5. Provide parents opportunities to volunteer and participate in their child's class, and to observe classroom activities, as follows:
 - Inform parents of upcoming activities, events, and programs through the website (http://turner.mce.schoolinsites.com), phone messenger, digital sign, social media, and monthly parent bulletins to assist in planning opportunities for involvement.
- 6. Ensure regular two-way, meaningful communication between family members and school staff, and, to the extent practicable, in a language that family members can understand, as follows:
 - Information on all school programs, activities, events, parent meetings, school and classroom newsletters, parent notices, etc. will be sent to parents in other languages as requested.
 - Utilize ESL Federal Programs services/support to provide interpretation assistance in verbal/written communications with parents as requested/needed.

Parent Responsibilities
