Career and College Readiness Resources

In today's global economy, students must be well-prepared for the demands of college and the workplace. New York Mills provides support to assist students as they transition to high school and into an increasingly wide array of postsecondary options. The options we offer is described below.

Concurrent Enrollment

New York Mills High School partners with Minnesota State Community and Technical College to offer the following college credit courses to our high school students. Students who successfully complete these courses generate both high school and college credit from the partnering postsecondary institution.

There is no cost to the student to participate in these courses. These courses provide high school students advanced skills today and greater flexibility when they enter the university setting. New York Mills High School offers the following Concurrent Enrollment Courses, taught by NYM teaching staff: Engl 1101, Engl 1205, Math 1116, Math 1114, and Chem 1100.

New York Mills also partners with M|State for online courses via eCampus. A student is able to take an online class where it fits in their schedule.

Postsecondary Enrollment Options (PSEO)

PSEO is a program that allows students in 10th, 11th and 12th grades earn both high school and college credit while still in high school. Most PSEO courses are offered on the campus of the postsecondary institution; some courses are offered online. Each participating college or university sets its own requirements for enrollment into the PSEO courses. Eleventh and 12th-grade students may take PSEO courses on a full- or part-time basis; 10th graders may take one career/technical PSEO course. If they earn at least a grade C in that class, they may take additional PSEO courses.

There is no charge to PSEO students for tuition, books or fees for items that are required to participate in a course. Students must meet the PSEO residency and eligibility requirements and abide by participation limits specified in Minnesota Statutes, section 124D.09.
