Message from Adminstration:

Dear Silver Streak Families,

Thank you for such a strong start to the school year! We appreciate the efforts being made to have your child at school each day and on time. Our Silver Streaks had an average attendance rate of 91% in August! Way to Go! We are grateful for the support for the Read 20 initiative and students demonstrating what they are reading with their reading logs. We were excited to deliver books ordered by Dr. Rodolfich to increase our classroom libraries. Please check out our website, www.janiehowardwilson.com, to see the titles of these books.

Our teachers are transforming the subjects to create an environment to make connections with a purpose of increasing international mindedness with the IB/PYP program. The lessons are designed for hands-on learning and for students are given opportunities for choice with the activities in the classroom. The science and social studies standards have been integrated into the IB/PYP transdisciplinary units.

The IB PYP Curriculum is organized into six units of study based on six transdisciplinary themes. Grades K-5 study all six themes throughout the school year organized into units. The units last between four and eight weeks. The six themes provide students with the opportunity to incorporate local and global issues into their learning. Through incorporating local and global issues into the curriculum, students can go beyond the confines of learning within each subject area.

The six themes are: How the World Works How We Organize Ourselves Where We Are in Place and Time Sharing the Planet How We Express Ourselves and Who We Are.

Each unit begins with an overarching concept as well as a central idea that focuses the unit. Teachers design lines of inquiry to guide the unit. Skills, known as approaches to learning are incorporated to ensure students are learning valuable skills that transcend the subjects. These skills include: Research skills, communication skills, social skills, self-management skills and thinking skills. Units are designed to promote critical thinking as well as help students to become well rounded in other areas of their life.

Teachers organize units to meet the local and state requirements. Teachers also ensure foundational skills are met throughout the units of study. When students work their units, they learn about other countries, cultures, ways to take action and ways we can share the planet with other people and other living things. They learn ways to express themselves, learn about who they are as individuals and as a community. They also learn how our world works and how the world is organized.

This month, your child will begin their progress monitoring assessments. This information will let the teacher know your child's strengths. The first interim reports will be going home the week of September 12th. We look forward to seeing all our families at our upcoming Open House on September 8th at 6:00pm. Please remember to reach out to either of us for any concerns, questions, or suggestions.







RE:

Asbestos Hazard Emergency Response Act "Notice to Building Occupants and Parents"

We are required by the federal regulation Asbestos Hazard Emergency Response Act (AHERA) to inspect all schools that have aspestos containing materials (ACM). This regulation requires that schools containing asbestos materials be inspected initially and then re-inspected every three years thereafter. Each school should have a copy of all inspection booklets in the school's Asbestos Management Plan File.


In addition, the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) requires that each year the Local Education Agency (LEA) notify in writing to parents, teachers, and students of the availability of Management Plans (results of inspection) for asbestos identified in each school. Pursuant to section 40 CFR 763.93(e) (12) (g) (4), this notice shall be dated and identified by school/facility.

Subsequent EPA guidance suggest that the most acceptable form of notification is to have the notice placed on school letterhead, dated, signed by the school administrator and issued to each student and parent, i.e. school newsletter. Specific text is required in this notice. A copy of the text is attached for you in English and Spanish and is also available at http://thehub.polk-fl.net/docs/ Click on Environmental Services then Asbestos. Insert your school name where indicated then prepare and issue the notice as suggested. Include a copy of the notice in your school's Asbestos Management Plan File and forward a copy to Tracy Hannah, Maintenance Services via e-mail (preferably), fax (863-519-3738) or through the courier to Route E no later than October 17, 2022.



NOTICE TO BUILDING OCCUPANTS AND PARENTS NOTIFICATION OF INSPECTION FOR ASBESTOS CONTAINING

MATERIALS IN PUBLIC SCHOOLS

The Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) has issued a final rule, 40 CFR Part 763, Asbestos Containing Material in schools, commonly referred to as AHERA. This rule requires all Local Education Agencies (LEA's) to identify asbestos containing materials (ACM) in their school buildings and to take appropriate actions to control release of asbestos fibers.


All inspections for Janie Howard Wilson Elementary have been completed and a Management Plan describing the results of the inspection and the action plan to control any asbestos found during the inspection, where applicable, has been submitted to the Governor for approval. A copy of this plan is located in the administrative office of this school and at the District School Board of Polk County Maintenance Department and is available for review upon request.

Reading Scholarship Accounts

In 2018, Florida became the first state to offer an education savings account program for students enrolled in public schools. The Reading Scholarship, administered by Step Up For Students, was created to help public school students in third through fifth grade who struggle with reading. The program offers parents access to education savings accounts, worth \$500 each, to pay for tuition and fees related to part-time tutoring, summer and after-school literacy programs, instructional materials and curriculum related to reading or literacy.

Who Is Eligible?

- Third- through fifth-grade public school students who scored a 1 or 2 on the third or fourth grade English Language Arts section of the Florida Standards Assessment in the prior year.
- Students who are classified as English Language Learners, and who are enrolled in a program or receiving services that are specifically designed to meet the instructional needs of English Language Learner students, will receive priority.

What Is It?

- The scholarships are worth \$500 each and can be used for reimbursement for the following:
 - » Tuition and fees for part-time tutoring provided by a person who holds a valid Florida educator's certificate, a baccalaureate or graduate degree in the subject area (Reading, Elementary Education, or English Education), an adjunct teaching certificate, or has demonstrated mastery of the subject area knowledge.
 - » Fees for summer education programs designed to improve reading or literacy skills.
 - » Fees for after-school education programs designed to improve reading or literacy skills.
 - » Instructional materials and curriculum related to reading or literacy.
- Program funds are limited and are available on a first-come, first-served basis.


