BOARD COMMENTS

Dr. Torri apologized for the misunderstanding and requested checking the minutes from the August 9, 2021 meeting to see that he asked if a motion was able to be made from the floor regarding a change to the district's mask policy. He commented he is ready to rescind his vote.

Dr. Goates commented he is disappointed with the wide spread misunderstanding of the district's Health and Safety Plan. He commented he holds the value of kindness and respect most dearly. He commented on his responses to e-mails and noted he has tried to respond respectfully.

Mr. Buterbaugh commented he wished the rest of the community was in attendance tonight and thanked the police for being at the meeting.

Mrs. Burg commented on the motion from the floor that occurred Monday, August 9, 2021 regarding the district's mask policy and noted the Board tried to act within the district's Health and Safety Plan. She also noted the Board wanted to be honest with the community of what would happen if a COVID outbreak would occur.

Mr. Suders noted he feels the comments made by Dr. Torri and Mrs. Burg summed up the situation.

Dr. Lyman reiterated that the vote regarding the masking mandate was dependent on current circumstances surrounding COVID-19 and also noted that things will continue to change and masking may not be permanent for the entire school year.

Mr. Buterbaugh thanked everyone for their public discussion and asked that it be kept civil as our teachers deserve that. He asked everyone to abide by the rules even if you do not agree with them.

CITIZENS COMMENTS REGARDING NON-AGENDA ITEMS

Mrs. Amanda McNair, resident of S.A.S.D., noted there was nothing noted on the August 9, 2021 agenda regarding masks and asked the Board to be careful about voting on items on listed on an agenda. She also requested meetings be livestreamed so they could be viewed online.

Mr. Buterbaugh noted the district is looking into livestreaming meetings.

Dr. Suppo noted the district is looking into livestreaming meetings but noted they will not be interactive. Those viewing it online would just see video and sound. They would not be able to comment.

Mr. Buterbaugh noted the public can submit comments to the Superintendent's office to be read at the next Special Meeting.

Mrs. Tamara Smith-Moore, resident and teacher in S.A.S.D., commented she attended the August 9, 2021 Board Meeting and noted the mask mandate went into effect because we are in a red zone as outlined in the district's Health and Safety Plan. She is concerned the district will adjust the Health and Safety Plan because of unhappy community members.

Dr. Suppo commented that normally Administration does not respond to citizen's comments but felt he needed to clarify that the Health and Safety Plan contains some area of ambiguity and some areas require thoughtful conversation around current circumstances of COVID-19 as it pertains to decision making.

Mrs. Teresa Reed, resident and employee in S.A.S.D., noted she appreciates the Board Members time and has personally talked with several of them. She noted they do not get paid for serving in this capacity and noted they are trying to do what is best for all our kids. She said their job is not easy. She thanked them for what they do. She also commented on the poor sound quality at the August 9, 2021 Planning/Action Meeting.

Mr. Troy Beam, resident of S.A.S.D., commented on OSHA guidelines for mask wearing and stated the N95 masks do not keep out the viruses, just bacteria.
