

Elmore County Public Schools Community Resources

The following are resources and programs available to the students of Elmore County Public Schools.

Elmore County Family Resource Center – (334) 224-1868

- The objective is to provide all children with a safe and supportive environment in order to optimize their learning experiences.
- A social worker is housed at all 6 elementary schools
- School personnel are able to refer students to social worker.
- Works alongside counselor to provide support to students and their families.

Council on Substance Abuse (COSA) – (334) 262-1629

Offers lessons on substance use, abuse, and prevention in middle schools.

Helping Families Initiative

 Works alongside the schools to assist with issues such as truancy and other barriers to academic achievement.

Under Age Under Arrest Program – (334) 213-6330

- Program through the ABC Board designated for 5th grade students that educates them on state and federal laws regarding youth access to tobacco.
- The program provides information relative to the laws and their consequences.

Elmore County Extension Office – (334) 567-6301

 Provides several research-based educational programs in agriculture; forestry, wildlife, and natural resources; family and consumer sciences; economic and community development; 4-H and youth development; and urban affairs.

The Bridge (334) 245-4199

- Substance abuse counselor housed at the alternative school.
- Provides campus visits.
- Provides early intervention.
- Outpatient treatment for ages 12-18.
- Provides individual and group counseling sessions to students via court order.
- Provides random drug testing to students via court order.

Health Rocks

- A proven 4-H Healthy Living program for youth ages 8 to 14.
- Applies 4-H's successful Positive Youth Development model with life skill development and decision-making philosophy to the challenge of reducing tobacco, alcohol, e-cigarette/vaping and drug use.

Elmore County Food Pantry - 334-567-3232

Provides food to families in need.

First Baptist Church of Wetumpka - (334) 567-5191

- Provides emergency food and clothing to families in need.



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211 Connects Alabama

- 211 is designed to provide information and referrals to health and human services and other social assistance programs.

Elmore County Partnership for Children (SOAR) - 334-478-7880

- SOAR is a Preventive Department that has partnered with ECPS for 17 years.
- Provides support education and specific drug preventive programs.
- Provides community awareness through substance abuse education and prevention services to individuals and schools.

Too Good for Drugs (through SOAR)

- 10 week program designated for 6th grade students about drug awareness.

Butterfly Bridge Children's Advocacy Center - (334) 478-4094

- Advocacy group that offers a safe, child-friendly environment to children victimized by abuse or neglect as it carries out the mission to provide restoration and justice.
- Visits schools to present information to the student body on various topics such suicide awareness.

Montgomery Area Mental Health (MAMHA) – (334) 279-7820

- Referral service for Montgomery Mental Health Authority.
- Counselors recognize when a concern is beyond their scope of practice.
- Our counselors contact the parent, provide a suggested recommendation.
- Counselors collect insurance information in order submit referral.
- MAMHA counselors visit school once a week.

- This program is dedicated to ending family violence sexual assault, and human trafficking through comprehensive services and community-based outreach and prevention education.
