How is it revised?

Who is it for?

All students participating in the Title I, Part A program, and their families are encouraged and invited to fully participate in the opportunities described in this plan. Villa Rica Elementary will provide full opportunity for the participation of parents and family members with limited English, with disabilities, and of migratory children.

2024-2025 District Goals

The percentage of students scoring at Proficient or above on the Georgia Milestone Assessment (GMAS) English Language Arts End of Grade Assessment will increase by 3% points.

The percentage of students scoring at Proficient or above on the Georgia Milestone Assessment (GMAS) Mathematics End of Grade Assessment will increase by 3% points.

To raise the GMAS scores of all students by 3% and to increase the scores for ELL, ED, and SWD by 6%.

2024-2025 School Goals

On the 2022 GMAS, increase the students performance in reading and mathematics by 3 percent.

K–1: Beginning sounds and sight words
