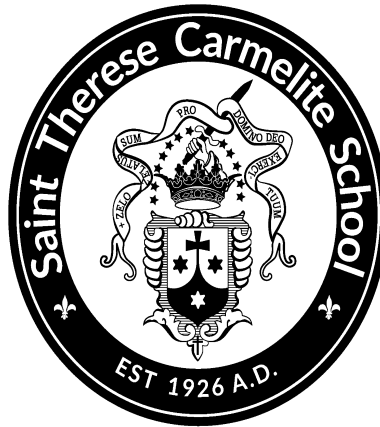

† GUIDELINES FOR FAST & ABSTINENCE (PER CANON LAW):

Abstinence: The law of abstinence requires Catholics 14 years of age and over to abstain from eating meat on Ash Wednesday and **ALL the Fridays of Lent** in honor of the Passion of Jesus. **Fasting:** The law of fasting requires Catholics from ages 18 to 59 to reduce the amount of food eaten from normal. The Church defines this as main meal a day, and two smaller meals which if added together would not exceed the main meal in quantity. Such fasting is obligatory on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday.

CATHOLIC TRADITION TALK



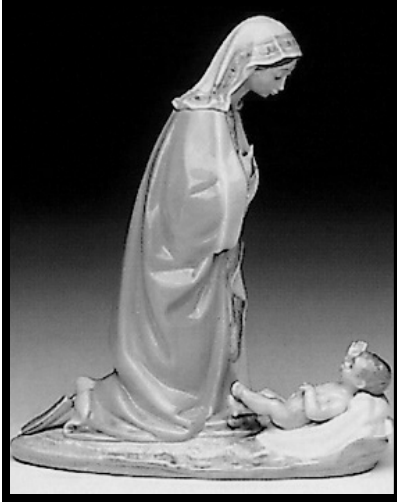

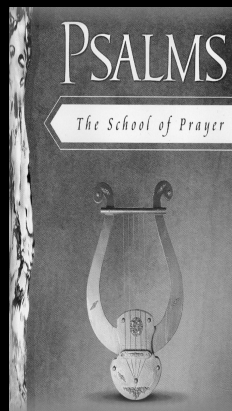

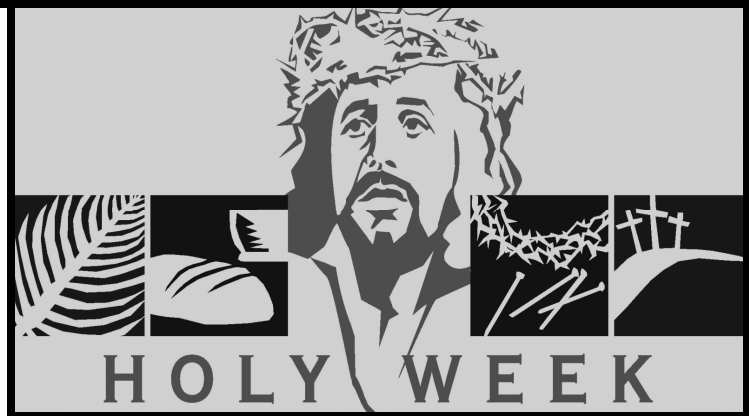

It's Holy Week! Today, the Sunday before Easter we celebrate Palm Sunday of the Passion of the Lord—the commemoration of Christ's entry into Jerusalem for the completion of the Paschal Mystery. Following the Jews' example, we proclaim Christ as Victor; but by our faith we know, as they did not, all that His triumph stands for. He underwent His Passion, the punishment for our sins, but He comes forth triumphant from the tomb, the victor over death, making our peace with God and taking us with Him into the kingdom of His Father in Heaven.

Except for the celebration of the Easter Vigil, **Holy Thursday** is one of the most important, complex, and profound days of celebration in the Catholic Church. During the night, after sundown—because Passover begins at sundown—the Holy Thursday Liturgy takes place, marking the end of Lent and the beginning of the Sacred "Triduum" (three days) of Holy Week—the holiest days in the Church. Holy Thursday celebrates the institution of the Eucharist as the true Body and Blood of Jesus Christ AND the Institution of the Sacrament of the Priesthood. This Mass stresses the importance Jesus puts on the humility of service, and the need for cleansing with water, a symbol of baptism. After Holy Thursday, no Mass will be celebrated again until the Easter Vigil. Just as Christ did for his twelve Apostles at the Last Supper and, as He commanded them to do likewise, during the Mass of the Lord's Supper, the priest ceremoniously washes the feet of twelve men. At the Holy Thursday liturgy in the Vatican, even the pope performs the foot washing. After the Last Supper and before He was arrested and condemned to death, Jesus went to pray in the Garden of Gethsemane, accompanied by the disciples. So after the Holy Thursday Mass, the remaining sacred hosts are carried out of the sanctuary to an "altar of repose." People stay for a time, adoring the wondrous Sacrament that Jesus instituted that day.

On Good Friday, the entire Church fixes her gaze on the Cross at Calvary. Each member of the Church tries to understand at what cost Christ has won our redemption. In the solemn ceremonies of Good Friday (the Veneration of the Cross, the chanting of the Reproaches, the reading of the Passion, and the receiving of the pre-consecrated Hosts), we unite ourselves to our Savior and contemplate our own death to sin.

On Holy Saturday we celebrate the Easter Vigil, the most beautiful liturgy in the Church—and the liturgy that marks the beginning of Easter. We are awaiting our Master's return with our lamps full and burning, so that He will find us awake and will seat us at His table. The vigil is divided into four parts: Service of Light, Liturgy of the Word, Liturgy of Baptism, and Liturgy of the Eucharist. From its very beginnings, the Christian community placed the celebration of Baptism within the context of the Easter Vigil. On this night, catechumens will be baptized, and the congregation will renew their Baptismal promises.

SELECTING THE GODPARENTS: Canon Law requires you to have at least one godparent (may have two) who: **1) is at least 16; 2) has been Confirmed; and 3) is a practicing Catholic.** A form attesting to this need to be signed by a priest from the parish of each prospective godparent.

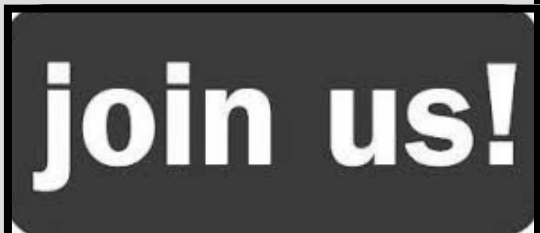
