Athletic Success

Our athletes have been performing in stellar fashion! Although our fall seasons are now finished, our school, students, and fans are looking forward to what the winter has in store.

Nebraska Christian has had the opportunity to have strong cross country teams in recent years, and this season has proved to be no exception. The boys and girls cross country teams were both Goldenrod Conference Champions and D-2 District Champions this season.

Both boys and girls cross country teams also made it to state competition this year. On Friday, October 21st, our teams headed to Kearney to compete against a number of the top high school athletes in the state. There were a total of 128 boys and 124 girls from all across Nebraska who came to compete in the 5,000 meter run.

The varsity boys finished 3rd overall, led by Jacob Swanson who placed 5th with a time of 17:17.3. This was his first state medal. The rest of the boys finished as follows:

- 41. Noah Fischer 18:23.56
- 84. Tug Burdett 19:34.11
- 97. Riley Schreiber 20:06.01

The NC girls also ran very well, finishing 8th as a team, but they were met with some incredibly intense competition. Hannah Swanson led the Eagles, placing 17th with a time of 21:15.84. The rest of the girls team finished as follows:

- 30. Isabelle Brumbaugh 22:03.98
- 78. Ava Brumbaugh 23:31.51
- 81. Amanda Carlson 23:36.72
- 101. Grace Musgrave 25:08.45

Along with cross country, the football and volleyball teams have also had exceptional seasons.

NC Volleyball has become a force to be reckoned with this season. This team has gained the titles of both district and sub-district champions. The Eagles ended their season Thursday, November 3 in

Lincoln when they faced off against the Knights of Norfolk Catholic.

Eagles football made it to the playoffs this season. The boys had taken a strong run towards the state competition, but the season came to an end Friday, November 4th.
