The volleyball team is still going strong as players finished up their last week before post-season. The girls played Melstone last Tuesday. The JV lost in three (13-25), (21-25), (13-15), and the varsity made the JV loss up by their win in five (18-25), (25-16), (20-25), (25-13), (15-13). On Friday, the girls played in Absarokee; both the JV (25-11), (25-7), (15-6) and varsity (25-12), (25-11), (25-15) won, and this win carries the team into this week as the Rebels head into districts. The volleyball team has worked hard, and it has paid off as the Rebels are going into districts second in the conference. They will play their first game post-season Thursday afternoon in Absarokee at 4:00 vs. Plenty Coups.

The Rebels finished up their regular season play in Absarokee and the football team sealed the deal on a conference championship with a 56-6 win over the Huskies — with a running clock in the first quarter. The 7-1 Rebels will host Lincoln in Custer on Saturday in a first-round playoffs game.

Last Thursday in Terry, the B girls won 16-12, the A girls won 62-6, the B boys lost 35-13, and the A boys lost 53-13. On Saturday, the Rebels played Sacred Heart in Hysham, and the B girls lost in a close game (28-26), the B boys lost (47-31), and the A girls soundly defeated their opponents (57-11).
