SPECIAL EDUCATION SERVICES

The following, is a short overview of what happens when you refer your child to be evaluated to determine if they qualify for special education services:

At first, the process of obtaining special education services for your child can seem complicated and confusing. Don't worry, as the Disabilities Services Coordinator for DEC, I can help you understand the process and direct you to other helpful information and resources.

*For infants/toddlers, birth to age 3, a request for a referral will be made to a NM Family, Infant & Toddler program-either the Native American Parent/Professional Resources(NAPPR) or to La Vida Felicidad program. Please let your child's teacher know or contact me if you have any concerns regarding your infant/toddler's development. We will assist you through the process.

*The Individuals with Disabilities Education Act (IDEA) requires local public school districts to identify, locate and evaluate every child (ages 3 and older) who may have a disability requiring special education services. This is called "CHILD FIND"!

The good news is that Grants Schools is conducting three Child Find clinics in the Cibola county area. Please see information in next column. The flyer will also be sent out to families 2 weeks prior to the scheduled dates listed for the Child Find events.

Greetings Families and Friends,

I hope this finds you doing well and enjoying the changing weather.

I just want to send out a few friendly reminders to parents and families for the month.

The DEC school zone speed limit is 5 MPH. When you come to the DEC campus, please be sure to follow the posted speed. If you are sending someone to the DEC campus, please remind them to comply with the school zone speed limit. This is a very important pedestrian safety protocol to follow. We want to keep all our families and friends safe while on campus.

Child drop off and pick up procedures have changed as of Monday, September 25, 2023. Parents and authorized individuals on the contact list are now able to go directly to your child's classroom and sign them in and out each day. Please make sure to close the gates, to keep children safe. You must have a car seat for staff to release the child. Staff will not release a child to anyone that may be under the influence of alcohol, drugs or on the sex offender's list. If you are visiting campus for any other reason, you are required to sign in at the front office. We appreciate your cooperation with this new procedure and hope it provides families a little more flexibility.

If you pick up your child from school, please ensure you pick them up by the time school ends: EHS 3:30 pm and PHS by 2:00 pm. DEC follows a procedure that addresses the neglect of a parent in which, if you are late picking up your child or your child is brought back from the pm bus run three times, social services is called to address why the child was not picked up. We ask parents to have open communication with the front office staff or the program director to prevent this from occurring. Children feel the effects of not being picked up or no one being at the bus stop to receive them home. Staff utilize their skills to calm the child and reassure them that they are safe until they are reunited with their family.

I want to thank all the parents for supporting your little ones as they are beginning their educational journey with the Laguna Division of Early Childhood. It is so good to see all their smiling faces here at school. Good job parents!!!
