




- 8. Senior Meghan Bohannon, at the Eiffel Tower states, "We didn't go to the top, but hey, we were there!"

























Summer Thrills




JORNEYS 14 Student Life


them to succeed and eventually we all pulled through on top."






What It Takes To Be A Leader

The year 2001 ushered in a new century for us all. The year also brought with it the formation of the first varsity bowling teams for boys and girls.


