# **Course Description:**

Welcome to 9th Grade Literature! This course will develop student understanding of different genres of literature. We will explore a variety of fiction and nonfiction texts and analyze how themes in literature relate to contemporary life. We will also produce cohesive and well-developed writing that reflects knowledge of the literature and literary devices, as well as awareness of audience and purpose using careful research, clear claims, and relevant evidence.

# Leaving Class:

Students are expected to take care of as much out-of-class business as possible during class change.
