Dual Enrollment



What is it?

The opportunity for students to take classes that count toward BOTH high school and college credit.

Benefits of taking DE Classes?

1. **Free College** - Students are allowed to take 30 credit hours of FREE college.
2. **Rigor** DE classes (along with AP classes) are often the most rigorous coursework offered. Four (4) Rigor courses are needed to earn the HOPE Scholarship. Rigor also allows students to be competitive for college admissions.
3. Get a **head start** on college coursework (decreases time in college)

Things to consider before deciding to take DE Classes?

1. **Am I ready for the Rigor?**

These courses are **COLLEGE** classes taught by **COLLEGE** professors.

**Time Management, Study Skills, Organization Skills are important*

2. **GPA** - DE courses **DO COUNT** in your high school GPA.

3. **Transportation** - If you have a DE class that is not on the VHS campus, you are not allowed on campus at that time. You will need transportation to come and go throughout the day as your schedule permits.

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When can I start taking DE Classes?

- **10th Grade – CTAE/Hands-on classes**
Criminal Justice, Nurse Aide, Welding, etc.
- **11th Grade – CORE & Academic Electives**
(English, Math, Science, Social Studies & Foreign Language and other Academic Electives)

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In what college should I enroll to take Dual Enrollment courses ?

Most students at VHS attend:

Southeastern Technical College

Brewton Parker College

East Georgia College

However, students are allowed to attend ANY college within the University System of Georgia.

(College Algebra) **(College Pre-Calculus)**

SOCIAL STUDIES *3rd Block*

Fall- HIST 2111/HIST 2112 **Spring- HIST 2111/HIST 2112**

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Dual Enrollment Courses at the college

***Note* - Coordination to schedule courses that accommodate both the college and VHS is important**
