

Dr. David Fischer: What A Wonderful Journey

Growing up in rural Warren established a steady base in the life of Dr. David Fischer, MN. Graduating in 1962 as Valedictorian of his class, he realized early in his life that academics and sports were terrific companions. Raised in a family with his folks and four sisters, David learned the value of hard work and developed a strong backbone in ethics. He fondly recalled the country schools and the early school systems in Warren. With one Washington School on the west end of town and a second school on the east end, the city of Warren had a very different look and feel from today. His recollections of middle school and facility are very acute. He remembers the school having a very small basketball court that included a gym with a stage that had a balcony that wrapped around three sides. During those years, David admits to being kind of an unruly, problem child! Although average, academically, he'd get an occasional "D" in "deportment" (similar to today's "behavior" or "conduct" grading). Miss Adelsman, his 6th grade disciplinarian-styled teacher, took him aside a number of times and would lecture him to "get his act together" and assured him that he could be a very good student. She reminded him that he should use his leadership skills to do good things, which he remembers to this day. Her intervention proved to be very influential for him. He fondly remembers playing annual competitive baseball and softball games in middle school, between the two Warren schools.

Once high school was in full gear for David, he actively participated in many sporting and extra-curricular activities. He was a member of the Letterman's Club and Student Council for all four years of high school while serving as an officer for his last two years. Other activities included: Declam, Debate, Chronicle Staff, Junior Class Play, Junior Class President, Football, Basketball, and Honor Society. He worked hard and studied hard. He was a starter on the famed 1962 Pony Championship Basketball Team. They unfortunately were defeated by Ada in the region 8 play-off round. Recalling those days, he spoke fondly of Coach Irv St. John when he commented, "Coach taught me and all the team members the importance of preparation, discipline, teamwork and how to deal with both loss and success." Coach Irv further taught him how to deal with success and loss with equal dignity. "These were principles, reinforced by my family, friends and community, which formed the bedrock of my life forever," according to David. Subsequently, Coach St. John moved forward in his career, relocating to coach basketball at Duluth East High School where he became the athletic director and earned the distinction of earning three Halls of Fame awards: Minnesota Basketball Coaches Association Hall of Fame, Duluth East Hall of Fame and the Bemidji State Athletic Hall of Fame, where he'd previously been an outstanding athlete.

In addition to Coach St. John, David recalls OJ Peyton as a teacher whom he remembered fondly. He shared memories of his high school classmates Maxine Knudsen, Don Vettleson, Gary Neegard (who works as a chiropractor in Minneapolis) and Lynn Maruska (deceased). David was thrilled when Coach St. John and his wife joined his WHS 50th class reunion in 2012. David enjoyed visiting with his former classmates and driving through Warren and viewing the expansion of the WAO School System. David's senior quote read, "Great in sports, great in studies, great in the hearts of all his buddies." His love for sports and athletics became a solid theme throughout his career and ultimately led him to his professional career ~ Orthopedic Surgeon in Sports Medicine, an Adjunct Professor at the University of Minnesota, and Minneapolis' Department of Orthopedic Surgery.

Dr. David Fischer's career began directly following high school when

he was accepted into the Undergraduate Program at Northwestern University in Evanston, Illinois where he graduated with honors in German Literature. His school years at Northwestern were interrupted to travel abroad for a year and a half and attend Schiller College in Germany. While there, David traveled extensively throughout the Middle East. While in Germany, he met his wife of 53 years, Andrea "Andi". In 1971, upon returning to the U.S, David began his studies at the Medical School and Orthopedic Surgery Residency at the University of Minnesota. He spent a year of training at the Nuffield Orthopaedic Centre in Oxford, UK and Robert Jones and Agnes Hunt Orthopaedic Hospital in Oswestry, Wales, UK. During this time, he traveled extensively throughout Russia. Following that year abroad, he began to practice at Hennepin County Medical Center in Minneapolis and subsequently joined the Department of Orthopedic Surgery at the University of Minnesota. The United States Army recognized his dedication and supported him to fulfill his obligation to the U.S. Army via inactive reserve; for which he is ever grateful.

While reflecting upon his choices in his career path, David recalls always participating in sports. He developed a particular interest in orthopedics following a high school shoulder injury. As a sophomore, he once visited his cousin in Minneapolis whose neighbor happened to be an orthopedic surgeon. His interest was further fueled immediately. As he got into his medical rotations, he found orthopedic surgery to be among his favorites. Initially, David found interest in soft tissue injuries and the fractures associated with the most severe injuries. The advent of the arthroscope and MRI allowed visualization and treatment of these injuries for the first time and these, along with the advances in physical therapy, sprouted his interest in combining them all into what soon became the field of Sports Medicine. He felt quite fortunate to be one of the earliest specialists who were in 'the right place at the right time.' This newly identified field offered David the opportunity to later become a Team Physician with the Minnesota Vikings and the Minnesota Timberwolves as well. He also completed a decade of work with the U.S. Olympic Committee including the 1992







Men's Basketball "Dream Team" and Women's Gymnastics in Barcelona, Spain. Throughout all these career assignments, David maintained his own practice and was raising his young family.

In reflecting back, David recalls his very first job was at the Hennepin County Medical Center, in Minneapolis, a teaching hospital. He spent his early years as an orthopedic surgeon there, specializing on traumas and fractures. From there, he became even more concentrated in sports medicine. His passion for his field continued to grow. He, as a founding member, along with a group of dedicated colleagues formed a sports medicine group, TRIA, as a joint venture between the University of Minnesota and Health Partners. This group has earned National and International recognition as a group of well-educated orthopedic surgeons aligned with sports medicine. Each year three Orthopedic Surgeons are selected to participate in a fellowship created by this group. TRIA conducts studies annually to advance treatment, care, and systems to improve lives and share findings around the world. The combination of research and education in a diverse organization of hospitals and clinics sets TRIA apart. TRIA provides incredible opportunities for making discoveries and then developing and implementing evidence-based ideas and solutions.

As David's experience grew and following the retirement of the previous team physician, the Minnesota Vikings approached and offered him the Team Physician position, five years later he was recruited by the Minnesota Timberwolves, whose franchise was just beginning. When discussing his relationships with the players and franchise staff, David states, "It's all about the people you meet, not just the players." As part of his duties, he traveled with the teams to all games and practices. His schedule grew more and more demanding, but he was living his career passion through medicine, private practice, working for the University of Minnesota and participating in duties associated with TRIA. He spoke fondly of the relationships and friendships he's formed throughout his years of service. Professionally, he commented, there was nothing like it. His surgical skills were sharpened by all the advancements made available to those professional athletes. All the

newest technologies and equipment developed were available to him. He was amazed by how much professional athletes could push themselves and their bodies. The advancements facilitated recovery for these elite athletes and could be applied to a more "normal" population. Through these unlimited resources developed to treat these elite athletes, it became evident that those advancements could also be extremely beneficial to all orthopedic patients.

In looking ahead to his future, David's plans include a slow retirement. Though he retired in 2019, he remains involved in educational activities and conferences. He currently remains active in TRIA's Fellowship Program and Alumni Association from an educational standpoint. His future plans, due to COVID, have been put on a bit of a hold, but he's looking forward to settling down. He plans to spend more time with his lovely wife and his children along with their 4 grandchildren. He wants to dedicate more time to his hobbies of woodworking, hunting, fishing, baking, cooking and being in the kitchen. He and Andi enjoy following the interests of their grandchildren and attending as many of their events as possible. He hasn't forgotten his days amid the hallways of the Warren High School and the solid foundation it provided him and his education.


