1) Meeting called to order at 5:04pm by S. Herrera

2) Approval of February minutes: Approved via email

3) Old Business

- ❖ Mr. Silva’s class created a video to thank the SSC for the opportunity to write a grant for new cameras for digital arts. The video highlighted students explaining how they capture high quality images and create projects for their class. The new cameras infinitely amplify the level of pictures captured and provide professional level experience.

4) New Business

- ❖ CAASPP Class Chats – Admin team is visiting all 11th and 12th grade classes, giving a package of cookies and encourage students to get high scores and be “smart cookies” during standardized testing.
 - 11th grade will test in the following subjects: English, Math, and Science
 - 12th grade will test in science
 - 11th grade Students will earn a Stole for graduation if they score a 3 or above
- ❖ PVHS Data
 - 583 Seniors have completed their Allan Hancock Application.
 - 473 Have completed their financial aid.
 - 579 Have completed their orientation.
 - 242 Have completed their first semester plan.
 - 225 Promise Scholarship awarded
 - AHC students receive account deposits when they complete an educational component
 - PVHS is 3rd in California for completing their FAFSA
 - Free meals until 2025 for students in California

- ❖ 2022-2023 budget approval is approved now *prior* to June 2022.
 - PVHS creates the budget according to current year expenses and trends
 - Start Budget was \$120,000
 - Highlights include expenditures
 - \$11,000 – professional development, online opportunities
 - \$15,600 – Classified hours to pay staff who work evenings to provide opportunities for parents (grade level meetings, technology trainings, PF4P, Cash for college, etc.)
 - \$5,300 – Release time for staff PLCs (lower than past years due to sub shortage)
 - \$11,400 – online software licenses for Social Science, English, International Language, (we will be adding Health next year)
 - \$8,000 – College and Career Awards (All honor cords for seniors)
 - \$52,000 – College and Career Center computer lab replacement and Math computer lab Room 607 replacement
 - \$11,300 – Tutoring Salary (we serve 100+ students per day)
 - \$8,200 – Link Crew Training (3 new mentors) - Mr. Edwards, Ms. Price, and Ms. Minarik
 - \$12,000 – Technology Grants for Staff
 - \$26,700 – Technology replacements for 179 staff (Tatung's, iPad, iPad covers, apple pencils, speaker systems, calculators, projectors, printers, toners, ink, xerox machines, maintenance contracts for those xerox machines, etc.)
 - SSC Committee: Mr. Edwards and Mrs. Baines will continue next year.
 - Will offer \$35-40,000 in Technology grants next school year to teacher
 - AP cost will increase when less are offered via Zoom
 - Need a motion and 2nd to approve this preliminary budget for 2022-2023
 - Motion / KC, 2nd / LB, all in favor of the preliminary budget for 2022-2023

5) Reports

- ❖ Student Report
 - Panther Olympics was a great success; Student Council will offer the event next year.
 - Movie night rescheduled due to gale winds.
 - Panther Pal Dance will be held in the cafeteria. Students will have an opportunity to dance, socialize, enjoy pizza, and ice cream.
- ❖ ELAC Report
 - Committee is learning about importance of student mental health.
 - They are cooperating with S. Molina regarding a district survey with input from parents, students, and staff
- ❖ School Report

- Standardized testing has begun. VLA and IS students have already tested. 11th graders test May 2 in English, Math and Science. 12th graders test in science. Scores reflected on PVHS report card.
- End of year banquets celebrations being planned. Events include year-end athletic banquet, FFA banquet, and senior awards night.
- ❖ Booster Report
 - Current board is creating opportunities for community involvement
 - Plans underway to make year-end donation equally to athletics and activities
