Dear Parishioners,

As most may know, I had another bout of whatever is going on with my stomach this last week, though this time it was different in some symptoms and duration. After a Saturday morning trip to ER to eliminate more concerning causes, they determined that it seems as I developed some form of enteritis - inflammation of the colon.

It started on Tuesday evening, and the pain intensified Friday and was fairly constant until Sunday afternoon... as I write on Tuesday morning, I am dealing with some of the other issues from calorie depravation to other intestinal issues, but I am on the mend. I have now a strategy in place for when this occurs again. I am following up with my doctor and will contact my gastroenterologist. Fun. What a way to begin the year!

Thank you for your prayers for the repose of my friend, Jolene (Welu) Hjelmberg. I offered the graveside service on Sunday afternoon in Milroy, with a good number of her family there. I am privileged to have known them for so long, as I was seemingly adopted as a family member because of my friendship with Jolene. As I left without staying for the reception (I could not eat anyway), I left marveling at the unique position I am often in as a priest – a father to none, but a son and spiritual father to many. I pray I never neglect or misuse this honor.

This weekend, we celebrate the Baptism of the Lord. Jesus had no need of repentance, yet He takes the baptism of John, a baptism of repentance. In doing so, the Church Fathers declare, He transformed the waters of the world to have the power to was away the stain of sin. The baptism we receive, transformed by Christ, renews the life of grace in us, washing away Original Sin. But that grace is one that needs to be opened and used.

Too often, it seems that some treat the sacraments like

stamps in a passport – just an official mark of what we have done. But the sacraments impart grace which is God's unmerited gift – a gift that must be accepted. As we celebrate the Lord's baptism, we might be wise in thanking God for our own Baptism and thanking God for the priest/deacon/bishop that imparted that gift. Perhaps we might even take time to memorize our baptism date, and plan to celebrate it. In Christ,




