Dance Tickets: Sale Dates and Procedures

*All ticket sales will take place during the lunch waves in the Culinary Building Thursday and Friday of each week

- > The presale prices are \$40 single or \$80 for couples on September 8 9
- > Ticket sales prices are \$50 single or \$100 for couples on September 15 16
- \geq Ticket sales prices are \$50 single or \$100 for couples on September 22 23

No Formal ticket sales after September 23 during the lunch waves

Tickets may/may not be sold at the door (TBD)

> If tickets are sold after the sale dates, they will be \$60 per person!

We DO NOT provide Refunds - Tickets are NON-REFUNDABLE

Bringing a guest? Follow these rules!

- Couples' tickets are sold ONLY to those bringing a non-Murphy GUEST; Only ONE guest allowed per Murphy student! Guests MUST BE ACCOMPANIED by Murphy student & will not be allowed to enter without the Murphy student.
- In addition, <u>completed guest request forms with attached photocopied ID</u> will be required in order to purchase a <u>couples' ticket</u>.
- Middle school students, adults over 20 years of age, and high school drop-outs will not be allowed to attend as guests.

Code of Conduct Policies

When purchasing a homecoming dance ticket, all students are agreeing to the following guidelines.

- Not to drink alcoholic beverages BEFORE or DURING the school function.
- Not to smoke BEFORE or DURING the school function.
- To conduct oneself as a lady or gentleman at all times during the school function.
- To uphold ALL Murphy High School and Mobile County Public Schools RULES and REGULATIONS.

Students on the **Do Not Admit** list or students with disciple problems will not be allowed to attend the dance and should not purchase a ticket. <u>Tickets are non-refundable and non-exchangeable</u>, even if the student is disciplined after buying a ticket.

The Homecoming dance is not a formal affair; it is semi-formal! This means that ladies can wear anything from a nice "Sunday" dress or skirt and blouse, to a sparkly party dress.

Usually dresses are not floor length—hems go from mid-shin to above the knee.

Cut-outs, deep open necklines, and low open backs are NOT allowed.

Remember—this is a school dance, not an adult Mardi Gras ball!
