Dear Parishioners.

This weekend is the 6-month mark of my heart attack. I remain thankful for your prayers and concern, and look forward to continuing to recovery, however slowly, from this.

I hope that I am not a broken record, but this significant event has had a profound impact on my prayer and faith life. While I have attempted in the past to 'Memento mori" – remember death - it has never been as real to me as it has been since the heart attack. While I still did not 'feel' that bad, to hear how serious things are and the proximity of death, this awareness is deeper. Knowing that I have a heart that is not functioning as it should reminds me that my life will end and that I need to be prepared for death – not just in the physical way of having a grave picked or final wishes communicated, but much more importantly, living in a way that leads to heaven.

Not all of us need serious illness (or to witness the suffering of others) in order to be more aware of our mortality. For those who need a reminder, I pray that this month be a reminder that we are going to die. It might bring a little fear, and we will need to discover the source of that fear. It can come from the unknown - and while we don't know what awaits, we know Who awaits -Jesus Christ. Fear of death can come from knowing we are not prepared or that we are caught in sin - conversion and reconciliation are always possible while we live. No matter what, we best prepare by remembering that the Lord is a loving Savior and a just judge. We beg His mercy in this life and in the next. But we should not fear death. Death is reality – we will not live forever. This awareness then influences our actions – does it lead me to Heaven or away? Is this helping me to be live freely the life of grace or binding me?

Next week is Thanksgiving Day already. Please plan on joining our Ecumenical Service on Wednesday, November 24, at 6 pm at the Church of St. Edward as we praise the Lord with thankful hearts in all times.

Dear families of DNU Catholic school students,

As of this week, COVID-19 vaccines have received emergency use authorization for children ages 5-11 in the United States. Already various strategies have been announced in states across the country to encourage vaccination of young children, including Minnesota. As we look to the role that Catholic schools play in helping parents and guardians make good decisions, it is important to restate Church teaching (Congregation for the Doctrine of the Faith, 2020 (CDF)), which affirms that "all vaccinations recognized as clinically safe and effective can be used in good conscience" and it is "morally acceptable" for Catholics to take a COVID-19 vaccine." At the same time, the CDF continues, "practical reason makes it evident that vaccination is not, as a rule a moral obligation, and that therefore, it must be voluntary."

Consistent with the Church's teaching on vaccination (including the COVID-19 vaccine) and united with the other Catholic dioceses in Minnesota, the Diocese of New Ulm affirms that as with all vaccines, Catholic schools of the Diocese of New Ulm recognize that vaccination of schoolage children is a decision of parents and guardians and is not mandated by Catholic schools. Parents and guardians make health care decisions for their children. An explanation of the Church's position can be found here. As with all healthcare decisions, parents and guardians of students in our Catholic schools should carefully weigh the risks and benefits in consultation with their healthcare provider.

We encourage you to meet with your child's primary care provider in an effort to make an informed decision in light of your child's particular health history, risks, and benefits associated with the COVID-19 vaccine. While Catholic schools have not been a significant source of transmission of COVID-19 since the start of the pandemic, our school remains vigilant and focused on ensuring our students receive the essential service of an in-person education and a place of encounter with Jesus Christ.

This position is formulated based on the currently available information. These considerations are subject to change as we learn more about the long-term effects of vaccination, as new COVID variants emerge, and other vaccines and treatments for COVID- 19 are developed.

Please join us in praying for a swift end to this pandemic.
