STOP VOUCHER EXPANSION

There are already 3 existing voucher bills that reallocate tax dollars away from public schools. This weakens public education and local communities. Please stop any attempts to expand voucher programs that divert public funds to private institutions.



CONTINUE RAISES FOR ALL POSITIONS

In addition to steep increases in the cost of living, school districts nationwide face unprecedented recruitment and retention challenges. The State of Georgia must provide financial incentives in order for districts to attract and retain quality educators.



PROTECT TRS

Continue to fully fund and support TRS. TRS is especially important for recruitment and retention. TRS works well, so there is no need for reform.

EXPAND RETIREE OPPORTUNITIES

To help with teacher shortages statewide, allow Teachers Retirement System (TRS) beneficiaries to fill any available teaching vacancy. Currently, TRS retirees may only teach in certain content areas. In addition, this change would also help the funding of TRS.



FULLY FUND QBE

Full funding is critical to student success. Improve the QBE formula by addressing poverty and updating the amount earned on the Weights for Salary and Operations. Fund the benefits for classified employees.



LOCAL BOARD CONTROL

To support local governance, legislation should align with the constitutional authority of school boards who best know the needs of their community.
