

Late Work

Students are expected to complete assignments on time. If there are extenuating circumstances that cause an assignment to be late, students and/or parents should email me immediately.

Please note that athletes do not receive accommodations for missing class time due to games and/or practice. Their assignments are still due on the due date.

Plagiarism/Academic Integrity

Cheating in any form will not be tolerated and will result in consequences for all parties involved. Copying on class/homework, quizzes, tests, or plagiarism is considered cheating. Students should not allow anyone to copy their work. Plagiarism is defined as presenting the work of another as one's own, including copying and pasting from Google. Students should always turn in assignments that are presented in their own words. Students involved in plagiarism incidents of any sort will result in a zero for the assignment. This also includes turning in work created by generative AI (ChatGPT, etc). Upon the first incident, students will be given an alternative assignment with the highest possible grade to earn being a 75. Upon the second incident, the student will receive a zero. Upon the third incident, the student will receive a zero and disciplinary action.

Any student who wishes to check out a book from my classroom library is asked to have a parent or guardian sign a permission slip (below) indicating that this classroom library notice has been read and understood.
