The Vernonia School Board is pleased to announce four finalists for further consideration to be the next superintendent for the Vernonia school district. The selected finalists are:

Lloyd Hartley

Dr. Hartley has 16 years of superintendent and principal experience in the school districts of Clatskanie, Glendale, and Long Creek from the state of Oregon. He is currently a special education teacher in the Alsea charter school. Dr. Hartley received his Doctorate of Education in Educational Leadership from Lewis and Clark College and has adjunct professor status with the same college.

Jim Helmen

Dr. Helmen currently serves as the Director of Student Services and Innovation for the Clatskanie (OR) school district since July 2020. Prior to his current position, he held the positions of middle/high school principal and assistant principal from 2015 to 2020.
