What is Title 1?

School Plan for Shared Student Achievement

What is it?

This is a plan that describes how Westside Elementary will provide opportunities to improve parent engagement to support student learning. Westside Elementary values the contributions and involvement of parents to establish an equal partnership for the common goal of improving student achievement. How is it revised?

Westside Elementary School invited all parents to attend meetings in the spring to review and revise this parental involvement policy, as well as the school wide plan, our school-parent compact and the parental involvement budget. The plan is posted on our school web site for parents to view and submit feedback throughout the year. All parent feedback received during the year will be used to revise the plan for the next school year. We also distribute an annual Parent Needs Survey online to ask parents for their input on revisions for the plan and the use of funds for parental involvement. During the revision meeting parents and stakeholders provide input on how funds are spent. Our funds pay for: PASS, Kinvo, Academic Coach salary, student and parent resources.

Who is it for?

All students participating in the Title I, Part A program, and their families, are encouraged and invited to fully participate in the opportunities described in this plan. Westside Elementary will provide full opportunity for the participation of parents with limited English, parents with disabilities and parents of migratory children.

Where is it available?

At the beginning of the year, the plan is posted on the school Web site and to Facebook. In addition, copies of the plan are emailed through Peachjar and Kinvo. Additional copies are available at the Annual Title 1 Meeting, in the Parent Resource Center and at Westside Elementary School's front office.
