






School Goals




State Goals







About Our School

BULLYING, HARASSMENT, AND SAFETY POLICIES

· In addition to our Positive Behavioral and Intervention Support (PBIS) program, in which students are taught to be safe, respectful, and responsible, we use the Second Step curriculum to teach social skills. We are also using the Six Pillars of Character and recognizing students who demonstrate these traits consistently. This year we introduced Conscious Discipline and Restorative Justice to facilitate a growth mindset in our behavior practices. All Humbolt Elementary staff are committed to building positive rapport with all students and maintaining a healthy and safe learning environment.

EXTRACURRICULAR ACTIVITIES

Our students are able to participate in a variety of extracurricular activities through strong partnerships with local governmental agencies, such as John Day Parks and Recreation, and community based non-profit organizations. Sixth grade participates in junior high sports at Grant Union Jr/Sr High School.

PARENT ENGAGEMENT

Humbolt is fortunate to have an active Parent Teacher Association (PTA) that meets regularly to plan events and engage parents throughout the school year. Both the PTA and school maintain web pages and Facebook pages to keep parents informed of upcoming events and important school news. A monthly newsletter is sent home to all families.

COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT

Community engagement is a key component in the success of Humbolt Elementary School. Humbolt partners with local agencies to provide opportunities to students, such as Painted Sky Art Center and OSU Extension Services.
