In an attempt to treat her condition, she invented a line of African American hair products and changed her name to Madam C.J. Walker. To promote her products, she traveled throughout the southern U.S. demonstrating her products including a brushing method and the use of heated combs. Her efforts led to her being one of the first American women to become a millionaire. Her legacy lives on with a product line that can be purchased at Sephora. Madam CJ Walker made enormous contributions to this month's theme of African Americans and Labor.
