QUALIFICATIONS:

- 1. High School Diploma or equivalent.
- 2. Health: Certification of good health signed by a licensed Physician. Be free of communicable diseases.
- 3. Demonstrated aptitude for successful completion of assigned responsibilities.
- 4. Ability to read, understand basic directions and make changes correctly.
- 5. Possess a valid driver's license.
- 6. Such alternatives to the above qualifications as the Board may find appropriate and acceptable.
- 7. Dress and present yourself appropriately for a school setting as you are a role model for students. Practices good grooming habits, with regard to personal hygiene, unquestionable cleanliness of body, clothing, hair, neat appearance, hair, and posture.

JOB GOAL:

To provide a clean, healthful, comfortable, and attractive building

MINIMUM PERFORMANCE EXPECTATIONS:

- 1. Thoroughly clean assigned areas
- 2. Thoroughly clean and mop restrooms daily
- 3. Lock all outside doors at assigned times
- 4. Recheck all outside and inside doors before leaving
- 5. Setup for evening activities
- 6. Clean up after evening activities
- 7. Set-up for next school day each evening
- 8. Thoroughly clean gym, locker rooms, restrooms, and lobby after evening activities
- 9. Fill paper towels, toilet paper, and soap in restrooms each evening
- 10. Sweep outside entrances as needed
- 11. Buff and scrub halls as needed, at least once a month
- 12. Disinfect all water fountains daily
- 13. Vacuum doormat as needed
- 14. Empty trash containers as needed, as least daily
- 15. Remove gum off floors and bleachers daily
- 16. Remove snow and ice from sidewalks and entryways.
- 17. Report any needed building repairs to the Maintenance Director
- 18. Put temporary hall gates in place

- 19. Be available for emergencies and to provide help as needed.
- 20. Although specific work areas and performance responsibilities are assigned to each custodian, a sense of cooperation and teamwork and acknowledgment for the need for accomplishing the tasks will be most productive.
- 21. Each custodian will have assigned areas in which he/she is totally responsible for the performance of the cleaning and sanitizing operations and for such work as may be necessary to enhance the attractiveness of the areas.
- 22. Specific area responsibility will be assigned by the Maintenance Director or the Superintendent, as well as hours worked.
- 23. During the fall and spring baseball and softball season, with the help of the lead custodian, empty trash and pick up trash around the ball fields on game days or as needed.
- 24. Assist in making sure we provide a safe environment for students, as per the risk management plan.
- 25. Other duties as assigned by the Maintenance Director or by Administration

EQUIPMENT USED:

Vacuum cleaner, wet mop, dry mop, shovel, and automatic scrubber.

WORKING CONDITIONS/ PHYSICAL DEMANDS:
