

Todd Ericksrud graduated from New York Mills High School in 1985. He was a three-sport athlete in high school. As a track and field athlete he was a six-time state place winner: (1984) 800-meter State Champion and set Class A State Meet Record; (1985) 2nd 800M, 2nd 1600M Sprint Medley relay, 4th 4x400M relay, 6th Place Team; (1984) 1st 800M, 4th 4x400M relay, 9th Place Team; (1983) 3rd 800M; (1982) 7th 4x400M relay. Todd is the school record holder in 400M, 800M, 1600M relay, Mile relay, and 1600M Sprint Medley relay, as well as holding the Class A State, Region 6, District 24, and Park Region Conference Meet record in 800M. He was team captain junior and senior year and is a six-year letter winner. As a football athlete Todd was two-time Park Region All-Conference, leading the conference in receptions (1983) and tackles (1984). He was team captain senior year and is a four-year letter winner. As a wrestler Todd was the 1984 Park Region Conference Champion, District 24 Champion and Most Valuable Wrestler, and in Region 6 he won 3rd place. He was team captain junior and senior year, and he was a four-year letter winner. When Todd went on to college, he ran track for North Dakota State University (1985-87) and University of Minnesota (1987-88). During those years he was four-time All-Conference in the 800M (2 x indoor, 2 x outdoor), and he finished 5th place at the 1987 Drake Relays in the 1600M Sprint Medley relay. His relay set the school record. Todd holds a master's degree in international logistics from The Georgia Institute of Technology and a bachelor's degree from the University of Minnesota. He is the co-founder of the New York Mills Civic Excellence Scholarship and is a passionate advocate for the Crohn's and Colitis Foundation to find a cure for inflammatory bowel diseases. Todd resides near Green Bay, WI, where he enjoys running, biking and spending time with his wife and four children.
